

**Resolution of Minsk gubernia administration to Slutsk uezd administration regarding the announcement to Mordukh Binder, Klimentiy Denisov Yavorskiy and Israil Mordukhov Ostrovskiy**

Recorded by Pogost rabbi on March 23, 1898:

“On August 8, 1894 Srol Abramov Ostrovskiy and his wife Ekheved had a son in the town of Pogost and named him Chaim-David”.

**Resolution Dated March 30, 1898 of Pogost Jewish community  
Excusing Mendel Ostrovskiy (son of Israil) from military service**

**based upon his family composition**

“It is hereafter confirmed that according to the family lists of our community of 1893, under #57, Mendel Ostrovskiy (son of Israil) who is eligible for military service this year; his father Israil who will be 40 by January 1, 1898; his brothers, Vulf, 11 years old and Chaim-David, 3 who was born in 1894, after the lists were completed in 1893. There are no other brothers who could prevent him from being excused. It is a first marriage for both his father, Israil, and mother, Yochved.”

owned by merchant Elia Ostrovskiy, son of Itsko

in accordance with certification #118 by Slutsk Uezd Treasury as of December 20, 1902 and patent of the same Treasury #37 as of December 20, 1901
