TRUSTEES' REPORT

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2017. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

CONSTITUTION AND OBJECTS

The Birmingham Progressive Synagogue is a Registered Charity (No. 242057) and is set up under its constitution and rules.

The objects of the charity are to provide a place of worship and facilities for religious education and instruction for Jewish people.

ORGANISATION

The trustees and members of the management council who served during the year are set out on page 2. The management members are elected by the membership in General Meeting, vacancies may be filled by the council co-opting members.

The council meet on a regular basis to manage the affairs of the Charity and to formulate policy. The charity's Administrator manages the day to day operations of the Charity in liaison with the Treasurer and President.

REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

The Statement of Financial Activities for the year is set out on page 7 of the financial statements. A summary of the financial results and the work of the charity are set out below. The charity's income is derived mainly from membership dues and donations together with interest from investments.

The Charity has unrestricted reserves of £2,510,785 (2016 £2,493,576). During the year the charity has maintained its financial position to help ensure its future and the trustees regularly review the free reserves available to meet day to day expenses.

The charity has now completed the seventh year in the new synagogue and financial results show a deficit for the year.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

Charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs to the Charity and its financial activities for that period. In preparing those accounts, the trustees are required to:

- . select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- . make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (cont)

- . state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- . prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operational existence.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 1993. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF

BIRMINGHAM PROGRESSIVE SYNAGOGUE

I report on the accounts of the Synagogue for the year ended 31st March 2017 which are set out on pages 7-12.

Respective responsibilities of the Trustees and Independent Examiner

The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act: and
- state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission.

An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the management committee concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in a full audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the accounts.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

For the year ended 31st March 2017

1. BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

These financial statements have been prepared on the basis of historical cost (except that investments are shown at market value) in accordance with:

- Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005)
- and with Accounting Standards
- and with the Charities Act 1993

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

INCOMING RESOURCES

a. Recognition of incoming resources.

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when:

- The charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- The trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources; and
- The monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

b. Incoming resources with related expenditure

Where incoming resources have related expenditure (as with fundraising or contract income) the incoming resources and related expenditure are reported gross in the SOFA.

c. Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

d. Tax reclaims on donations and gifts

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the SOFA at the same time as the gift to which they relate.

e. Investment income

This is included in the accounts when receivable.

f. Investment gains and losses

This includes any gain or loss on the sale of investments and any gain or loss resulting from revaluing investments to market value at the end of the year.

EXPENDITURE AND LIABILITIES

a. Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS (CONT)

For the year ended 31st March 2017

ASSETS

a. Tangible fixed assets for use by charity

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least £500. They are valued at cost or a reasonable value on receipt.

Fixtures and equipment is depreciated at 15%-33% per annum on cost depending on the nature of the asset.

b. Investments

Investments quoted on a recognised stock exchange are valued at market value at the year end. Other investment assets are included at trustees' best estimate of market value.

c. Stocks

These are valued at the lower of cost or market value.
