STRICTLY FOR WOMEN

GAZPACHO

This is a most refreshing iced soup for a hot summer day  
and very decorative for a special occasion.

Ingredients

1 large onion	½ - 1 pint vegetable or
1 green pepper	chicken stock <u>or</u> a tin
1 clove garlic	of tomato juice
1 15oz tin tomatoes	1 teaspoon sugar
	Salt and pepper to taste

Method

Put onion, pepper (without the pips) garlic and  
tomatoes through the mincer.  
Add all the liquid, sugar and seasoning.  
Stir well and put in fridge.  
Serve with croutons or Melba Toast.  
If you are serving this before a "Milchig" Meal, a  
blob of cream on each serving is delicious.

1 lb. large prunes, soaked overnight  
Cook gently and add juice of 1 large lemon  
Add 2 tablespoons cinnamon.
