1853 as shown below. Note that Details in blue indicate a hyperlink to further information.

The records of Eastern Europe are in hard bound books. Many are over sized and tightly bound. The paper is old and fragile. Imagine opening and closing, putting a book under hot lights over and over to microfilm or copy pages. Imagine many, many requests with books off the shelves for months at a time. This is not a quick and easy process. That is why so many archives have made arrangements with the Church of Latter Day Saints to microfilm records. That is to preserve their original record books. That is why we encourage you first to see if records exist on the Belarus SIG, to see if there is a current project for your shtetl or District, to make contact with your Coordinator to see if records have been translated.
