The Jewish Cemetery of Dubossary consists of two major sections: Old section, where the burials are dates up to 1930s and a New section, where most of the burials are from after the war, from the end of 1940s up to the current time.

New Section

Number of burials: 235, this is the number of records submitted to JewishGen. There are also 15 burial sites in that section with unknown graves. They are available at the Bessarabia SIG / Cemetery section or directly at <u>Unknown Dubossary New Section graves</u>.

Photographs: 222

Language of the inscriptions: mostly Russian, but there are several in Hebrew.

Dates: Burials in this section are from end of 1940s up to 2013.

The New Section has a re-burial site from a very old Jewish Cemetery in Dubossary. The old cemetery was destroyed in 1950-1955 during construction of the hydropower plant on the Dniester River in Dubossary. Now there is a DOSAAF (auto club) built at the location of the



cemetery.
