Kishinev Cemeteries where Jews were buried - protection of graves/cemeteries, rules to keep up the conditions of the sites

- There are at least 3 existing cemeteries where Jews were buried and are buried now:
 - Jewish Cemetery (on Skulyanka, Milan street);
 - Doyna Cemetery, where Jews have sectors;
 - Main town cemetery (Armynaskaya street), where honored people are buried (scientists, Communist Party members, etc.).
