Jeff's maternal grandmother was from Botosani, Romania. Jeff's paternal grandparents came to the U.S. from Poland; Jeff has extracted tens of thousands of Polish records for JRI-Poland and the Czestochowa-Radomsko Area Research Group.

Jeff's website, <u>www.levitedna.org</u>, is devoted to R1a-Y2619 Ashkenazi Levites, a Y-DNA cluster that includes about 60% of Ashkenazi men with a Levite tradition (and about 8% of Ashkenazi men), all of whom are descended from a single Levite man who lived about 1,750 years ago. Jeff is a co-author of Dr. Doron Behar's 2017 article on R1a-Y2619 Ashkenazi Levites, D. Behar et al., The genetic variation in the R1a clade among the Ashkenazi Levites' Y chromosome, SREP-17-37687 (2017).
