The unrestricted funds deficit for the period of £276 (1997: deficit £55) has reduced unrestricted reserves carried forward at 31 March 1998 to £1,963.

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1. STATUS

3. TURNOVER

4. DIRECTORS AND EMPLOYEES

The directors received no remuneration during the period and there were no employees.

5. ACCRUALS AND PREPAYMENTS

The sum of £360 has been allowed for accountancy fees. Any membership fees not yet collected will not be taken into account this year.

6. <u>RESTRICTED FUNDS</u>

The Restricted Fund of £628 at 31 March 1998 may only be used for the purposes appointed by the donors. The Education Fund of £337 at 31 March 1998 may only be used for the purpose of education courses.
