2. Any idea where my ancestors from Edinet and Brichany would be buried?

- 3. What's the status of Briceva Cemetery? How many people are involved in the cemetery restoration project in all of Bessarabia? We only photographing graves, indexing them and sending to JOWBR for everyone's use. We also doing "Clearing paths projects" for some cemeteries, where there is no access to every grave. After that we are adding more images/records to the database. There are several other organizations who are working in Bessarabia cemeteries, putting up fences, etc. I am going to write more about this subject into Discussion group.

- 5. How do I find the original revision list? Most of our original Revision lists are from Family Search. Usually when you get a record you also have a link to a Microfilm with that Revision list. It also gives you a record number, page number, etc. and knowing that you could find that one image with your record.
- 6. I have been told my great grandfather was from Khotyn, Ukraine. A relative told me that he was from Bessarabia.I am a new researcher. Does this sound like my g grandfather was from Bessarabia? Your relative is correct. Khotin was a major town in Bessarabia, a center of uezd (district). Today Khotin is located in Czernovitz oblast of Ukraine. Town

- 10. Are there specific records or info for Calerash? Yes, there are some Revision Lists for Kalarash (old name Tuzora). You can go to Romania/Moldova Databases and go to Introductory pages for our databases, and in Revision List Introductory pages you find all years of Revisions for that town.
- 11. Would Strozanitz Bukawina near to Bessarabia have records in Bessarabia database? No, that town was never part of Bessarabia. It is part of Bukovina, and there is a lot of resources for Bukovina in JewishGen http://czernowitz.ehpes.com/resources/resources.html and outside JewishGen: http://czernowitz.ehpes.com/resources/resources.html and outside JewishGen: http://czernowitz.ehpes.com/ that is a terrific site for that region!
- 12. Is it possible that a record for a family in Ataki is registered in Kishinev? Yes. Family could be registered in one place (Registered in Estate society for Merchants, or "Meschane"(Middle Class) or Farmers), and family could live in another place. Also, some family lived in one place and got married in another place, etc.
- 13. Are there records for businesses in Chisinau (Kishinev) before 1906? Yes.
