Bessarabia Special Interest Group (SIG) – history and projects



Bessarabia SIG explores historical region of Bessarabia and part of Moldova Republic which is on the left bank of Dniester River – Transnistria unrecognized territory.

Bessarabia is combination of Yellow and Purple

Republic of Moldova is combination of **Yellow and Green**

Pridnestrovie (Transnistria) is Green

Purple - parts of Ukraine

Brief geography and history of the region

1812 – Russian Empire occupied this land after Russia-Turkey war and Bucharest agreement.

For more than 100 years it was part of the Russian Empire, and in December of 1917 the area established a national assembly which proclaimed the Moldavian Democratic Republic, but in April of 1918 legislative body voted for unification with Romania. It was under Romanian rule until 1940, when it was occupied by the Soviet Union, see Molotov-Ribbentrop pact of 1939.

1941 Romanian and German army invaded the region, until Soviets took it back in 1944. After that Bessarabia was under Soviet Union control, and South and North parts were added to Ukraine Soviet Republic and the rest to Moldova Soviet Republic.

Brief geography and history of the region

Brief history of Jews in Bessarabia

1812 – only 5,000 families or 20,000 Jews lived in Bessarabia. In less than 100 years, in **1897** Jewish population had grown to 225,000, 11.7% of total population.

1903 – pogrom in Kishinev. 47 Jews killed, 424-wounded. In 1903 and 1904 there were 20 pogroms in Bessarabia towns.

Bessarabia SIG was organized in 2011, at the IAJGS conference in Washington. Before 2011, Bessarabia was part of RomSIG.

About 15 years Bob Wascou (z''l) started and administered a large Bessarabia Vital Records project. We continue to work on this project.

We are receiving Vital records directly from Kishinev, we are waiting for records for 1923

We started many other projects since 2011.

What we did from July 2024 to July 2025

Bessarabia SIG progress from July of 2024 to July of 2025

Vital records: added 11,967 records.

Births: **5,083**

Marriages: 3,456

Deaths: **3,428**

Total number of Bessarabia Vital Records – 202,033

Revision Lists: added 16,840 records for 3,226 families.

Total Bessarabia Revision List records – 315,273

What we did from July 2024 to July 2025 (cont.)

Bessarabia SIG progress from July of 2024 to July of 2025

Moldavian Jews Victims of Soviet Oppression: 1040 original records have been updated, 291 new records added.

Bessarabia Court Records: added 8,293 records added.

Bessarabia Cemeteries:

Project Leader Yefim Kogan

Kaushany – Old Jewish cemetery, DEMOLISHED - 31 records

Kaushany – New Jewish cemetery, DEMOLISHED - **50** records with 10 images collected from family members

Kishinev Jewish cemetery – added records from two sectors, **6,686** records with **3,576** images.

There are total of 18,751 records at Kishinev Jewish cemetery.

Teleneshty – Old Jewish Cemetery, records were updated and added new records and images

Teleneshty – **New Jewish Cemetery,** records were updated and added new records and images

What we did from July 2024 to July 2025 (cont.)

Vertuzhany – Jewish cemetery was photographed; indexing is on the way.

Gershunovka – Jewish cemetery was photographed, but not yet indexed.

We have a terrific group of Volunteers - dedicated people who are working hard on our multiple projects.

Without Volunteers our research and progress would be very limited.

Revision Lists – Elena Shulman retired from Project Leaders. Well, we are almost done with the Revisions. I will take care of it.

Vital records – this project is the oldest for our Bessarabia SIG, and in order to speed it up we need more **translators from Romanian** (after 1918 most of the records written in Romanian).

We have sources for many new projects, but without your participation we cannot even start them, for example:

Educational records (schools, colleges);

Jewish Hospital in Kishinev

List of Jews from Kishinev who did not receive Romanian citizenship, 1939

- Archives. Finding more Jewish records at the Kishinev, Soroki, Czernovits, Kherson archives, and acquire them.
- Cemetery Projects.
 - Continuing photograph gravestones and indexing of Kishinev and Beltsy Jewish cemeteries
 - Index Vertuzheny Jewish Cemetery.
 - Ryshkany, Beltsy uezd, about 100
 - Kremenchug, Soroki uezd, about 20 tombstones remained
 - Tsybulyovka, Transnistria. It seems demolished cemetery, but there are some parts of stones on the ground.
 - Onitskany, Kishinev uezd. Cemetery was demolished, but there are 4 stones laid on the ground.

- **Destroyed Cemeteries.** Start working on a new initiative collect names of Jews who were buried in DESTROYED Jewish Cemeteries. That project was started, and we want to continue it
- Yizkor Books. Initiate more Yizkor Books translations:
 - o"The Jews in Bessarabia. Between the World Wars 1914-1940" (Tel Aviv, 1973) book is three quarters translated!
 - o"Upon the Land of Bessarabia; Studies, Memoirs, Articles, Documents and Essays Depicting its Image" Tel Aviv, 1959. Not translated!
 - Many more books waiting to be translated.

To accomplish this project, we need to find more volunteer translators from Hebrew.

- **KehilaLinks websites.** We have KehilaLinks websites for 19 towns/shtetlakh in Moldova and 7 in Ukraine.
- For many large towns we do not have a KehilaLink website. For example: Lipkany, Kagul, Rashkov, Vad Rashkov, Soroki, etc.
- We need a person who will oversees all Bessarabia/Transnistria Kehila Links websites.
- Our Bessarabia/Transnistria region should have at least 100+ **KehilaLinks websites**. If anyone wants to help, please contact me.

• **Business Directories.** Find more Business directories for Bessarabia or excerpt information from All Russia Business directories for Bessarabia we did not have yet.

Expand Gallery of Famous Jews:

- 122 writers
- 48 Painters, Sculptors, Architects
- 93 Composers, Singers, Actors
- 18 Scientists
- 12 Religious leaders

Any volunteers to continue this work will be much appreciated!

- **People's stories.** I am sure that every Jewish family has a story to share. We have only 25 stories at our website. I believe it should be 250 or more.
- Travel Reports. We have only 10 such reports.
- Family Trees. Only 7 at our website.
- Emigration from Bessarabia stories. Only 4.

We need a volunteer who will publish such stories and encourage our members to send their stories, travel reports, and family trees to our website.

As you can see, we have many exciting projects in progress that cannot be accomplished without Volunteers.
