ABRIDGED NEWS REVIEW

The recent decision of certain Eastern European Countries to permit a small stream of Jews to escape from behind the Iron Curtain and make their way to Israel whose doors have been opened wide to receive them, has resulted in a frantic race against time to build the many hundreds of houses needed for the newcomers.

The Israeli Government's carefully prepared and balanced plans, must perforce go by the board since homes must be provided for the newcomers and last years immigrants must

continue to exist in their improvised shanty towns patiently awaiting decent homes of their own. But where is the additional money to be found not only for the houses but to finance medical attention, education and employment for these hopeless people whilst still maintaining the ever important defence programme.

The money liberally donated to J.P.A. from all parts of the world where Jews live is insufficient and the burden of taxation must continue to weigh heavily on the Israeli people despite the substantial Government loans that are being floated in an effort to balance the already overburdened Budget. Instead of understandably attempting to minimise their difficulties by limiting, if only slightly, this immigration, the Government is using every endeavour to get as many fellow Jews out of Eastern Europe before any possible change of heart on the part of the Kremlin.

Meanwhile the flow of immigrants continues for North Africa as a result of the uncertainity of the Jewish position there. By contrast, Vest Africa, particularly the new States of Ghana and Nigeria are on the friendliest of terms and busily engaged in Trade with Israel and it is only by such trade with other countries that Israel can continue to exist.

Mhat are Israel's exports today? The citrus fruit trade is of course widely known but this year for the first time in history first quality cotton— superior even to Egyptian cotton it is said — was exported to England. Grown in the well known Lachise area the crop, however, is still comparatively small and further research by Israel's scientists is necessary before it can be produced on a large scale.

In the field of industry, expansion in the manufacture of textiles has been greatly assisted by the production of this home grown cotton and the home-spun cotton yarn in turn is being manufactured into lovely clothing for export.

The problem of providing packaging for both the citrus fruits and textile exports has been solved by theerection, in record time, of a cardboard processing plant, the biggest and most modern of Israel's factories. Yet another large factory, partially financed by a Colombian hosiery manufacturer is in course of erection and again the bulk of production will go for export. It may not be very long before we in this country will be able to buy socks marked "Made in Israel". Helping to cut down on imports and thus saving valuable hard currency, is the new rayon producing plant at Ashdod, while the discovery of valuable chemical deposits in the Negev has resulted in rapid expansion of the all important chemical industry,

From the Negev too, experiments in irrigation over the past years are at last meeting with great success and in what was once arid descrt, a wide variety of crops, including sizal, various cereals, pomegranates, sugar beet, cabbages and many others are being grown.

On the all important food front there is further good news in Israel, Switzerland and Japan have combined to operate a deep sea fishing venture using a refrigerator ship to bring back fish from the South Atlantic and Indian Oceans, while energetic efforts are being made to fish the previously neglected Red Sea.

While the Scientists grapple with their problems and Mr.Levi Eshkol with his, while the border settlers are ever, on the alert with their rifles ready at hand, still the Syrians snipe across the border and the United Arab Republic continues to pour out slander and vituperation over the air. Still too, Mr.Ben Gurion pilots the Ship of State through the troubled waters of international diplomacy and one day soon, we all fervently pray, we shall see Israel enclosed in a haven of security, sheltered for all time from the harsh Vinds of aggression.
