An open letter from the Chairman of the Talmud Torah.

Dear Parents,

How many of you, a few Sundays ago, were tempted by the fine summer weather to take your children to spend a day at the Seaside, in the country, or even possibly at the Country Club? Did you, at the time, spare a single thought for those Members of the Teaching Staff who regularly and faithfully give up their leisure on Sunday mornings during term time to instruct your children in the elements of our Jewish heritage? How many of you had the courtesy to notify the teaching staff or ask leave to withdraw your Children from classes that day?

I feel quite sure that the majority of you would not dream of using so slight a pretext for depriving your children of a single days attendance at their secular schools even though this would be such a small part of their schooling in comparison with the meagre 2½ hours a week at Cheder.

I cannot stress too strongly the great debt of gratitude that you, as parents, owe to the hardworking and conscientious teaching staff of the Talmud Torah who deserve all the support and encouragement that can be given them.

Please let there not be a repetition of Mr. Colin Berk's experience on that particular Sunday when only one child in his class put in an appearance otherwise how can we ever hope to keep the Talmud Torah in existence.
