Dear Everyone,

"The day is short, and the work is great, and the workers are sluggish, ---"

The above statement from the Firke Avoth reflects our attitude to letter writing. However, "The Master of the House is urgent", therefore, in order to compensate for all the letters we owe, we decided to write one letter that P.G. will please those whom we haven't answered.

Time has moved on almost to the extent of one year since we leftBristol. We are now settled in an apartment which is at one end of a racetrack of appartments with one semi-circle of the race track omitted. These fifteen blocks of apartments contain more Jews than all of Bristol and this section of town is appropriately termed the ghetto. We certainly have improved status-wise as far as living conditions are concerned and throughout the winter our English hot water bottles lay idle.

However, our brief taste of England lessened our inherent American materialism such that we miss much of what is available to everyone on your side of the world. Friendships are almost the same the world over yet they were cultivated quicker in Bristol. Very little entertainment exists outside the home, especially as we were spoiled by the theatres of Europe. We cannot go to New York every second week (or as you say fortnight), the plays in Montreal are costly and amateurish, we have not succumbed to T.V., the movies are so-so, therefore, the focal point of group gatherins is at home. The big advantage of a thriving Jewish city is the availability of Jewish culture. Almost every evening can be spent attending lectures covering a vast range of Jewish topics, joining study classes in Torah, Talmud, Hebrew speaking, etc.

The above is the general picture of life in Montreal We have become a part of this, but our nomadic spirit has not left us. All is movement which is formed by specialized segments (I may sound like a Beatnik but I am not). My training in England serves me well, yet I feel I need more, thus it is quite possible that we will move once more, this time to the United States where I hope to obtain a Master's Degree in Business Administration. Many Americans work their way through college I hope to sing my way through.

Pircha carries a fair load on her shoulders as she teaches a regular class each afternoon in addition to managing the household. The 25th hour of each day is also found in order to keep up, as a member of the three groups that she joined. One is similar to W.I.Z.O, one is a Hebrew Speaking Group, and the third is a Psalm Study Group.

Our little Rachelle is of course the only one of us that you are interested in, since she is the only Bristolian in the family. She is a little "she" and almost the duplicate of her mother, except that she is (as we say in Canada) cuter. She still has those big eyes and she knows how to use them Everyone on the street is greeted with a friendly "Hi"and then she lapses into her highly sophisticated foreign language which at this stage is highly inunderstandable.

Undoubtably many important events have occured in Bristol since our departure. We approciated and thoroughly enjoyed all the letters received and we certainly want to continue the correspondence. In fact we promise to answer promptly all letters, so let us hear from you.

Dear President Podgorny,

On the occasion of the 55th. Anniversary of the Soviet Union, I urgo you to release......, Jewish prisoners. They have served part of their sentences & their friends & relatives would welcome a gesture of good will by you.
