WINSTON CHURCHILL

"And there has not srisen a prophet since in Israel like Moses, whom the Lord knew face to face, none like him for all the signs and wonders which the Lord sent him to do in the land of Egypt, to Pharoh and to all his servents and to all his land, and for all the mighty power and all the great and terrible deeds which Moses wrought in the sight of all Israel." (Deuteronomy 34 Verse 9.)

The concluding words of the Torah could be a fitting spitaph for Winston Churchill. Although the words are as true today as when they were first written, there is a remarkable parallel between our own great leader and the one whom we now revere and remember. Both forecok their aristocratic environment to serve the people; both were inspired to their major task while in the wilderness (in Churchill's case - a political isolation). Both had the gift of prophecy and the power to inspire with the spoken word. Both Moses and Churchill performed miracles and succeeded against overwhelming odds. Both brought their people to safety in the eight of the enemy, for boses, too, hid his "Dunkirk" - happily in his case a victory. Moses and Churchill were, in their time, both rejected by the people and neither were able to go into the Promised Land. In Churchill's case that Land has not yet been reached even by the peoples of the world.

It may be that as history comes to be written the details of Churchill's life before 1933 will be forgotten and will be as obscure as those of Moses' before the events leading up to the Exodus. Moses was God-inspired and saved Israel. Surely Churchill was also destined by the Almighty to inspire the actions which saved the world.

As we Jews, who owe him so much, join the nation in mourning the passing of this great leader, may we also thank God for so inspiring him may each one of us gather strength to follow Winston Churchill's example, so that he may not have lived and worked in vain.
