MESSAGE FOR NEW YEAR 1969/5730

In order to be prepared to welcome the approaching New Year, we will have to look back to the important events of the past year. In spite of the fact that humanity has tremendously improved with the exploration of the Universe, we were still not able to settle the great problems which the nations are facing on this planet generally. The U.N.O. administration did not succeed in finding a peaceful solution for the many countries who are still engaged in military warfare. Especially Israel, where, after its miraculous survival two years ago, it continues to defend its country against terrorism from its surrounding Arab neighbours. All these events are occupying our minds for their meaning and purpose, particularly when we are standing at the threshold of a new year.

Many of us enter our Synagogues on these approaching High Festivals in the traditional spirit of the season. We are aware of the holiness of these days, and we are seeking by our devoted prayers and repentance to renew our faith for Judaism and Jewish ideals.

But many others of us are left uninspired by the sound of the SHOFAR, the prayers and the holiness of these Days. How do we account for it? Our High Festival season and its message of faith and inspiration is based more likely on the preparation of the human mind. We cannot enter into the spirit of repentance and good deeds while the voice of conscience and religion remains silent throughout the rest of the year. " YOUNG FAMILIES TOUR TO ISRAEL
March 26th - 9th April, 1970

You are probably aware that we are planning a Young Families Tour to take place on March 26th, 1970, and we are very anxious that all our members should be informed of this. For this reason we would ask you to make every effort to draw their attention to this.

The price of 109 gns. includes the return fare by regular El Al Jet Boeing, and a two weeks' stay at the Ein Hayan Hotel, Mathanya (demi-pension). The charge for the children between the ages of 2 and 12 years will be 70 gns. only.

Four full days' sightseeing will be included in the price, and the children will be looked after by English-speaking staff while their parents are away sightseeing. The older children, of course, will be welcome to join the sightseeing tours.
