Bristol Civil and Ex-Services Israel Tour 1971.

When the guest speaker, Mr. Eilan addressed a J.P.A. Meeting in Bristol, he stressed the need to identify oneself with Israel by visiting the State. The opportunity to do so is now literally right on your doorstep because we are forming a Group Departure to Israel leaving Bristol on 25th April and returning on 9th May, or by arrangement, a week later.

This is a holiday organised by a reputable Jewish travel agent, and although in itself it is a complete package deal, there are

days when one may relax on the glorious sands and bathe in the calm Mediterranean at our base town of NATHANYA, or alternatively go off on supplementary excursions.

The holiday as quoted includes, coach travel to and from airports and around Israel with English speaking licensed guides, a meal on both flights, ample free baggage allowance, accommodation in twin-bedded rooms with private bath or shower and with large Israeli breakfast and evening meal at a smart hotel near the sea.

Sightseeing will include visits to Herzlia, Bar Ilan University, Jaffa - Tel Aviv, the wine cellars of Rishon-le-Zion, the nuclear physics institute at Rehovot, full day tours to Jerusalem and Bethleham and Nazareth and Galilee.

General price increases of 10% are scheduled for 1971, but by booking early, we have secured an reasonable price of £130 per person for the trip as quoted. We intend to lay on local evening entertainment as optional extras and a free tree-planting picnic.

Apart from occasional skirmishes at the cease-fire line, there is very little warlike activity within Israel and it is significant to note that in 1970, tourist traffic was up by 30%.

Israel offers unending contrasts of Biblical and Modern achievement and there is guaranteed dry weather and not too hot temperature during our visit.

If you or your family are interested, please contact me early so that when our quota of 30 is reached, I will invite you to my home to hear discussions on the trip. You should note that the offer is open to 5,000 Civil Servants in the Bristol area.
