## SUPPER BY CANDLELIGHT

The 9th of Av, a most important day in the Jewish way of life, and I don't think that there is any Congregation in the World which does ignore this day, surely we can say that in Bristol in the 27 years I have been connected with the Bristol Hebrew Congregation, this day has always (with very few exceptions) been commemorated by the Chevra Kadisha in one way or another, all of which I have attended. I would not have liked to miss any one of them. On Sunday the 20th of February, The Bristol Jewish Burial Society held a Dinner Party at the Synagogue to celebrate this day, some 30 to 40 Members of the Society and Congregation attended. Our Lord Mayor and Consort honoured us with their presence. The organisers of the Function had this year, some considerable difficulties to overcome, and the obstacle of no light or heating would have been sufficient to force any other organiser to cancel such a Dinner, but our Ladies were determined not to be beaten by strikes, power cuts or any other obstacle, the Dinner was on, and what a Reception and Dinner it was, by no means ostentatious, but fit for a Queen.

The candle-light enhanced the atmosphere, in spite of the fact that all the food had to be brought from the Kitchen to the Committee Room this was not noticeable in any way - everything went smoothly, no delay and the quality of the Dinner was excellent.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Ladies who have worked hard and willingly to make that evening the success it was. The Chevra Kadisha and the Bristol Hebrew Congregation can be proud of such a team of voluntary workers, most of whom work throughout the week, to sacrifice the one day of rest they get to give us such an enjoyable evening - WELL DONE LADIES, thank you very much.

# MESSAGE FOR PASSOVER 1972/5732

It was an experience for me when I went last Friday night to the Synagogue here in Bristol, which like the surrounding area was completely covered in darkness owing to the emergency electricity regulations. Unfortunately, there was no service as on the previous two Friday nights, due to the same power restrictions. Walking home through the dark streets and approaching the Redland district where the street lights appeared in limited numbers, brought to my mind a similar situation, only by more severe power cut regulations by the Almighty, during the time when there was thick darkness for the Egyptians. At this occasion, we find the following statement in the Scriptures:

"ULICHOL BINEY YISRAEL HAYA OR BIMOSH-VOTAM"
"BUT ALL THE CHILDREN OF ISRAEL HAD LIGHT IN
THEIR DWELLINGS."

According to the Commentators, even those Jews who did not live in the Jewish area of Goshen but in the midst of the Egyptians had light in their habitations, while their neighbours lived in darkness. In this statement is expressed the vital factors contributing to the miracle of Jewish survival. When darkness surrounded the Jew, he ever found light and inspiration within the home. It is the whole atmosphere of the Jewish home which brings the richness of Jewish ideals, the symbol of the MEZUZAH on his doorpoot, the dietary laws, the beautiful custom of ZEMIROT, table hymns on the Sabbaths and Festivals.

This home environment has a special meaning at our Seder celebration on Passover. There is no other occasion in the Jewish year when we have the opportunity to explain to our children what the meaning of Judaism is as we find it expressed in the HAGGADAH:

" V'HIGADTA L'VINCHAH BAYOM HAHOO"

"OH THAT DAY YOU SHOULD TELL YOUR SON".

Tell your children the story of the EXODUS. Tell them why the Sedernights are different from all other nights with all the symbols placed on the Seder-plate. Give them to understand that we Jewish people have only survived in Egypt and through the thousands of years of Jewish history because we kept our identity as Jews. Passover is regarded as the Festival of Freedom. It has brought liberty to a number of Jews from Russia to be reunited with their families. Let us hope that we will be able to celebrate this wonderful Festival of Passover with our brethren in Israel in possession of full freedom and

security as we find it in our HAGGADAM in the following quotation:

- " HOTZIAHU MEY-AVDUD L'CHEYRUT MIYAGON L'SINCHAH MEY-EYVEL L'YOMTOV UMEY-AFEYLAH L'OR GADOL UMISHIBUD LIG'ULAH ".
- " HE TOOK US OUT FROM SLAVERY TO FREEDOM, FROM SORROW TO JOY, FROM MOURNING TO A FESTIVAL, FROM DARKNESS TO GREAT LIGHT AND FROM BONDAGE TO REDEMPTION ".

With these inspiring words of our Haggadah go our Best Wishes for a Happy and Pleasant Yomtov to the Hon. Officers and all the Members of the Bristol Congregation.
