BRISTOL CAMPAIGN FOR SOVIET JEWRY

1. Owing to circumstances beyond the Chairman's control, the Chanukah service on College Green on the 6th December was called off. On behalf of our Committee, I can only apologise to those people whom it was not possible to contact in time and who were inconvenienced as a result. We would like to say to all those who did come and those who were intending to come, that we hope very much that you will continue your support of our Campaign, despite the minor setback. We have been exceedingly successful to date with two demonstrations, 'phone calls, letter writing and other activities and we know that with continued backing from you we shall achieve what we set out to do.
2. A petition concerning the Ransom tax on Jews who wish to leave the USSR has been signed by 72 lecturers and research workers at the Bristol University Polytechnic. It will be despatched to the Academy of Sciences in Moscow, as it mainly concerns academics.
3. A parcel containing new clothes has been sent to one of the Bristol Campaign's "adoptees" in Russia, Benjamin Shapira, and his family. The Shapiras are in need of help of this sort as Benjamin has been sacked from his job. They find it almost impossible to get work now they are "marked" for applying for a visa to emigrate.
4. Over 50 telegrams have been sent to President Podgorny concerning the review of exit applications of 56 Moscow Jewish families, from people in Bristol. Among those who sent telegrams were The Bishop of Bristol and the Vice Chancellor of the University: also many others of all denominations.
