BRISTOL CAMPAIGN FOR RUSSIAN JEWRY

On Friday, 6th July at the Guildhall, Bath, a Russian team is participating in the European Chess Championship. The organisers of the Bristol Campaign for Russian Jewry have decided to stage a demonstration at this event to draw attention to the plight of Russian Jews who wish to emigrate to Israel.

Those wishing to join the demonstration should meet at the entrance of the multi-storey car park, Walcott Street, Bath between 5.p.m. and 5.30.p.m. Instructions will be issued at that point.

It is to be a silent, peaceful demonstration with placards and leaflets.
