## MESSAGE FOR SHAVUOTH 1974/5734

The celebration of the Festival of Passover, which has brought the Freedom to the Jewish People from Egyptian slavery, would have been meaningless without commonorating the important Festival of SHAVUOTH with its significant characteristic of the Revelation on Mount Sinai, where the Jewish People received the Torah.

According to the Midrash after the Nations of the World have refused to accept the Ten Commandments as the foundation of the Torah, the Jewish People, by accepting the Torah, have become the founders of civilisation of humanity. The Revelation on Mount Sinai should not be regarded for us as a matter of the past, but it should affect our daily life, as we find it clearly stated in the Book of Joshuah, Chapter 1, Verse 8

"LO YAMUSH SEYPER HATORAH

HAZEH MIPICHA V'HAGITAH BO YOMAM

VALAYLAH L'MA-AN TICHMOR LA'ASOT

K'CHOL HAMATUV BO KI OZ TATZLIACH

ET D'RACHECHA V'OZ TASKIL"

THIS BOOK OF THE TORAH SHALL NOT DEPART FROM YOUR MOUTH, BUT YOU SHALL MEDITATE THEREIN BAY AND NIGHT, IN ORDER THAT YOU MAY OBSERVE TO DO ACCORDING TO ALL THAT IS WRITTEN THEREIN; FOR THEN YOU SHALL MAKE YOUR WAY PROSPEROUS AND THEN YOU SHALL HAVE GOOD SUCCESS"

This quotation brings us to the conclusion that the Torah is not like other books of Law, for lawyers and scholarsonly. It has been given to everyone of us, regardless of our profession, occupation and scholarships. The Torah is written in such a way that each one can take out of it what he needs on his level of understanding.

Our Rabbis are saying there are ten things for which a man is receiving his beneficial blessing in this world, while the capital rewards remain in the world to come. This statement which we are saying at the beginning of our morning prayer is concluding with the following words:

"V'TALMUD TORAH K'NEGED KULAM"

"BUT THE STUDY OF THE TORAH EXCELLS THEM ALL"

Since the Torah is our guide in our daily life, we should spend as much as we can with the study of the Torah.

As we are approaching the Festival of SHAVUOTH, it will be our pledge to live according to the principles of our Torah. In this way we can look forward to the time of peace and security in the State of Israel and for the fulfilment of our Scripture;

"VIH'YITEM LI S'GULAH MIKOL HA-AMIM"

"YOU SHALL BE UNTO ME THE TREASURER AMONG THE NATIONS".
