Compliments apart, I know that you need material, so I will make a few observations. Having been an Editor myself, I realise that you have the power of the pencil and eraser; also that controversial subjects can sometimes escalate into open war (viz: S - TH v. N-W-AN) in the mid 60's.

Be that as it may, I will launch my first arrow, by observing that the Community has settled down into a pleasant apathetic rut, with infrequent rounds of various charitable efforts for a number of worthy causes. Religion plays very little part in the lives of the members, but soon the yearly effort will fill up the large spaces in the Synagogue. Old friends and relatives will renew acquaintance with each other, and with the Liturgy. It will be a time for penitence, prayer, resolution and rejoicing. It is good that at this time, we remind ourselves of the tinding faith (the cement) that has kept our people together in spite of centuries of oppression and strife. Perhaps between the prayers and the casual conversation, we could spare a moment's thought for the future of the Bristol Hebrew Congregation.

It is neither my province nor my intention to preach. We all know how the good people strive to keep our Synagogue not only beautiful, but intact, and how there is now serious effort starting to re-house the congregation in a building which, please God, will be a thing of beauty and a joy forever. But who will use it? Who will pray there? Will there be a Bristol Hebrew Congregation? I am told there are some twenty children in the Talmud Torah and yet on a Shabbas morning, only two boys of pre-Barmitzvah age attend and only one past-Barmitzvah boy (one other attends when he can). Yet those twenty children in the Talmud Torah are the congregants who will one day form a nucleous around which the congregation of the future will survive. I fully realise the difficulties with regard to education liabilities, but not all the children have to attend school on Saturday. I know this is an old cry, but parents, the future is in your hands. Either we are to have a living vibrant community, or the Bristol Hebrew Community will become ancient history, buried in stories of the past, of minyans three times a day and overflow services during the Yom Tovim.

I have been deliberately controversial, and I hope that what I have written will stimulate others to feed your starving columns, dear and dearest Editors.

We should have expected that such a tragical event would have influenced the members of our Community to find their way to the house of worship during the year, but like a magical wand, we are always waiting until

the YAMIN NORAIM the High Festivals of ROSH HASHANAH AND YOM KIPPUR are approaching us when Synagogues are again crowded with worshippers.
