MESSAGE FOR PASSOVER 1975/5735

...........

Jewish people all over the world are again preparing for their most favourite Festival, the Feast of Passover. This Festival is distinguished under the heading in our Liturgy as "Z'MAN CHEIRUTEINU", "The Season For Our Freedom". It was a great day of Liberation for the Jewish People, who served 210 years under the Egyptian Pharachs as slaves, when they became free men. From that day Israel has shown to the world that every human being is entitled to dignity and freedom.

When appointed as leaders of the Jewish People Moses and Aaron apporached King Pharaoh with the famous Keynote: - 'SHAIACH ET AM' 'LET MY PEOPLE GO'. They repeated their mission with these motto words many times until they succeeded to get the Jewish People out of the land of oppression and enslavery.

How popular have these words "LET MY PEOPLE GO" become in our present time with regard to our brethren in Russia. In spite of world opinion, which has brought a number of Jewish People out of the country, Russia continues to follow the example of the Egyptian dictators of the Pharaohs. As a reminder there will be a vacant chair for these unfortunate of our brethren when we are sitting round our Sedertable joined by our relatives and friends with the various kinds of special dishes on our Sederplate. We are explaining to our children the meaning of our Passover celebration and stressing to them the importance that the history of the redemption of the Jewish People from Egypt has its great message to us in our present time as we are reciting it is our MAGGADAH with the following words "LO ET AVOTEYNU BILVAD GA-AL HAKADOSH BARUCH HU ELA AF OTANU GA-AL IMAHEM" "FOR IT WAS NOT OUR ANCESTORS ALONE THAT THE HOLY ONE, BLESSED BE HE, REDEEMED HE ALSO DELIVERED US WITH THEM".

By celebrating our Seder in the old traditional way we are encouraging our children with the spiritual idea of our Judaism and we are bringing near the time when Jewish People will be able to live their free life even in those countries where they are still enslaved. We hope P.G. to look forward to the great message of our HAGGADAH "L'SHANAH HAEA-AH BIRUSHALAYIM HAB'NUYAH". "MAY WE BE IN THE COMING YEAR IN A JERUSALEM REBUILT".
