JOINT ISRAEL APPEAL (J.I.A.)

To the Readers of the Recorder.

The Bristol J.I.A. Committee have now opened the Compaign for 1975 and in keeping with practice over the past few years, will conduct it by personal canvass. When the Committee members call on you, try to remember that they are dedicated people, who do not shirk the difficult task of trying to extract as much as they can for one of the greatest causes it has ever been the privilege of Jews to support.

Of course, everyone realises that we are sorely tried here, by our own economic difficulties and each day brings a fresh crop of price rises, which add to the already high cost of living.

When you are asked to give, however, remember that this, where Israel and its citizens are concerned, is a time for sacrifice. They must have support from the Diaspora, and the Jews outside the Land must realise that the subjugation or, God forbid, the disappearance of Israel would be a disaster, not only for Jews of this country and throughout the world, but a serious set back for a balanced economy in the Middle East and a dire threat to world peace.

So that whether we support Israel from a religious point of view, a political one or on purely humanitarian grounds, we must give our fellow Jews the utmost help.

Ponder carefully on my words and do not forget them when called upon. There has been no formal appeal since the Yom Kippur War in 1973. Make your sacrifices and remember that in helping Israel, you are not only aiding your own people, but are also ensuring your own survival.
