A. Tale of Two Cities.

Dickens' original two cities were London and Paris. Mine are Bristol and Haifa.

Since I was born in Bristol, I can justly claim to be a Bristolian, albeit for the last 20 years I have resided in Haifa and so I am proudly a Haifaite and an Israeli.

Which city is more beautiful is hard to say, though personally, perhaps because it is an 'our land', I am slightly prejudiced in Haifa's favour. But perhaps you Bristolians, you will come and see for yourselves - and then take a vote. For Jews in our time, all roads should lead to Israel.

And so, to my tale. Last September, I decided to join an Ivrit class (in our parlance, an Ulpan). Our teacher is a young married woman, a Sabra, and we all like her very much. After knowing her all these months, we found ourselves recently sitting next each other at an "at home" given by one of our fellow students.

For the first time she inquired from which quarter of England I had come. When I replied Bristol, I was very surprised at the incredulous expression on her face. Bristol? Did you say Bristol? she queried. Replying the affirmative, she then told me that, as a newly wed in 1963, she had lived for two years in Bristol and that her eldest child had been born there. She knew the Yoffeys and had been especially friendly with the Norvic family. Her husband had spent a total of seven years in Bristol as a student, and had regularly helped to complete a 'Minyan' on Friday nights and Shabbat mornings.

Their family name is Nissim, perhaps some of you may remember them. They have very happy memories of Bristol and its Jewish Community. Particularly they would like to know Mrs. Norvic's present address, as through the years they have lost touch. If anyone can supply it, they will be very grateful.

So there you have it and here in Haifa we have an Israeli Sabra, who was born in Bristol. It would be a nice gesture if someone with a daughter of her age would invite her (on a reciprocal basis). But that is just a suggestion of my own.
