DIFFERENCES BETWEEN JUDAISM AND OTHER RELIGIONS IN THE USSR.

JUDAISM.

OTHER RELIGIONS.

No central organisation, no federation of congregations.

The Russian Orthodox Church, the Greek Orthodox Church, Islam, Buddhism, each has central co-ordinating bodies.

No kinds of communication permitted among the various Jewish communities in the USSR. Legally authorised to convoke the congresses and conferences of clergy and lay representatives.

DIFFERENCES BETWEEN JUDAISM AND OTHER RELIGIONS IN THE USSR. (Continued)

JUDAISM.

OTHER RELIGIOUS.

Not a single religious publication is authorised.

The Russian Orthodox Church publishes an official Review of the Patriarchate of Moscow, which emanates from the highest body of it's hierarchy. It also publishes religious texts. The same is true for Islam.

No Hebrew Bible authorised since 1917.

The Bible in Russian, of which a first edition was published in 1926 for the Russian Orthodox Church, was re-printed in 1957. Another Bible in Russian was published for Baptists. The Koran was published for Muslims in 1958.

No edition of Siddur between 1917 and 1956. In 1956, a single printing of 3,000 copies was published.

Relatively large quantities are available for the various religions.

No government aid.

The government makes publishing houses and paper available.

Manufacture of prayer shawls, phylacteries, matzo is practically forbidden. Permitted to produce the entire gamut of ritual objects - candles, crucifixes, rosaries, etc.

One synagogue and one rabbi for each 25,000 worshippers. (Based on estimate made in 1960, since then, the number of synagogues and rabbis has declined.

One church for each 1800 practising Orthodox, one priest for each 1100 practising Orthodox, one church and one minister for each 500 Baptists.

A single so-called yeshiva in Moscow with four students.

The Orthodox Church has two Academies and eight seminaries. Islam as four training centres.

No foreign contacts permitted.

Moslem students study in El-Azhar in Cairo; Baptists in Great Britain. The Russian Orthodox Church is affiliated with the Ecumenical Council of Churches and has sent observers to the Council.
