MESSAGE FOR PASSOVER 1979/5739

After one of the most severe winterseasons in memory we are looking forward to the approaching PASSOVER, the great Festival of our Freedom with joy and tranquility. Very soon families will gather round the festive table to celebrate the great event of PASSOVER with prayer and song and good cheer in accordance with Jewish Custom. In every generation the Jew recalls the experience of his fathers who stepped forth from servitude to freedom. This feeling is well expressed in a passage of the HAGGADAH

"In every single generation it is a man's duty to regard himself as if he had gone forth from Egypt, as it is written: And thou shalt tell thy son on that day saying: It is because of that which the Lord did for me when I came out of Egypt. "Not our fathers only - continues the HAGGADAH - did the Holy One, blessed be He, redeem, but also us did he redeem with them as it is said: And he brought us out from thence that he might bring us in to give us the land which he swore unto our fathers".

The Seder Service with it's historical explantion, hymns and symbols provides for the active participation both of father and child. By question and answer, those two generations understand why this night is different from all other nights, why also Israel's history is history of a difference.

What does the Festival of PASSOVER teach us in our present time? Looking around in our world today we will find that the Western World is placed in a more dangerous situation owing to the fact of Russia's expansion politics and the extreme Arab and Islamic influence against Israel. It is therefore encouraging that the United States of America has taken the initiation to bring Egypt and Israel together for a final signing of a peace treaty.

That this great event is taking place in the month of Nisan will be of great significance because the month of Nisan has brought liberty and Freedom to the Jewish People after they have been enslaved for over 200 years under Egyptian dictatorship. Therefore we may be able to now look forward that the peace treaty will gradually bring the final Redemption to the Jewish People and the Nations of the World.

In this way lot us celebrate the approaching Festival of PASSOVER with the fulfilment of the famous words of the HACGADAH

"V'NODE L'CHA SHIR CHADASH AL G'ULATEINU V'AL P'DUT NAFSHEINU"
"WE SHALL THEN OFFER UNTO YOU A NEW SONG FOR OUR REDEMPTION
AND SALVATION".

WITH THESE FAMOUS WORDS OF THE HAGGADAH go our best wishes for a happy and pleasant Yemtoff to the Hon. Officers and all the members of the Bristol Congregation.
