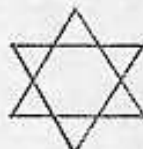

MESSAGE FOR THE NEW YEAR 1979/5740

As soon as we enter the month of ELLUL we are preparing ourselves for the High Festivals. The prophet ISAIAH has given it's expression to this important period of the Jewish Calendar with the following words - "DIRSHU HASHEM B-HIMATZ -O K-RA-UHU BIH-YOTO KAROV" "SEEK YE THE LORD WHILE HE MAY BE FOUND. CALL YE UPON HIM WHILE HE IS NEAR".

This verse, implying that there is a time when the request for G'd is particularly blessed with success, is applied by the Rabbis to the Ten Days from ROSH HASHANAH to YOM KIPPUR. That G'd is near to us at all times and that we can approach him without having to wait for a special period of the year is basic to Jewish teaching. But these Days, known as the Ten Days of Penitence, are a period where special care should be taken in prayer and other religious observances and special attention to be paid to consideration for the needs of others.

As ROSH HASHANAH is also called YOM HAZIKARON the Day of Remembering so we are looking back to the year 5739 which has brought the satisfaction of the signing of the Israeli-Egypt Peace contract. Negotiations are still going on with the authorities regarding the autonomy of the Palestinians at the Western Bank.

As we are opening the portals of Synagogues all over the world on these very important Festivals on ROSH HASHANAH and YOM KIPPUR may our prayers be accepted by the Almighty on High.

Let us hope that the New Year 5740 will bring Freedom, Security and Permanent Peace to the Jewish People in Israel and all over the world, as we find it well expressed in the additional Service on ROSH HASHANAH

"HASHEM Z-VAOT TAGEIN AL AMCHA YISRAEL BISHLOMECHA"

"THE LORD OF HOSTS BE THOU A SHIELD TO THY PEOPLE ISRAEL WITH THY PEACE".
