MESSAGE FOR SHAVUOTH 1980/5740

The greatest event in Jewish history took place when the Jewish people were assembled at Mount Sinai to receive the Ten Commandments.

On Pesach we are commemorating the Release from Egyptian bondage which has brought the Jewish people physical freedom. With our approaching Festival of Shavuoth we are celebrating the anniversary of our spiritual freedom. Jewish teaching insists that the proclamation of the Ten Commandments and the covenant between G'd and Israel are for all time. Towards the end of his life Moses emphasises this statement in an important declaration to the Jewish people, "Not with you only do I make this covenant and this cath but with him that standest here with us this day before the Lord our G'd and also with him that is not here with us this day." We find it here clearly stated that the Torah applies to past and future generations. The Jew can never regard the Torah as old fashioned, or its teachings as having outlived their original purpose. The Torah contains the highest religious truths attainable by humanity in a state of perfection, and provides an eternal guide to mankind in every generation.

Looking round in our world today we can see that chaotic situations do exist in those countries where the fundamental principles of humanity are not observed.

As we are approaching the Festival of Shavuoth it will be our pledge to live according to the principles of our Torah.

Let us hope that with this celebration of the 32nd Anniversary of Yom HA'ATZMAUT we will be able to look forward p G to the time of permanent peace and security in the State of Israel and for the fulfilment of our Scripture.

Dear Friend,
