MESSAGE FOR PURIM 1962 / 5721

We are always looking forward to celebrate this wonderful Festival of PURIM. The MEZILLAT ESTHER is the most popular Book of the Bible by its fascinating story and dramatic action. But it is not only a book which we are reciting on PURIM owing to the fact that it is the anniversary of the happenings in Persia over two thousand years ago but there is a great message which this famous story can give us in our present time. We admire with great esteem the actions of the great heroes MORDECAI and QUEEN ESTHER who in the most critical situation, when the decree to exterminate the whole Jewish population of Persia has been signed, and sealed by Haman were determined even to sacrifice their life by safeguarding the Jewish People from destruction.

After the defeat of their enemies Queen Esther and Mordechai wrote the great event of PURIM with the final conclusion. DIVREI SHALOM VE-EMET " WORDS OF PEACE AND TRUTH". These words peace and truth provide the key to the outstanding significance by this book of MEZILLAT ESTHER which speaks of a time when there was neither peace nor truth. It was only by war and bloodshed that the AMALEKS of all historical periods could continue their domination.
