OBITUARY - MR NAT SACOF

It was just as we were going to print last Month that we heard of the passing of Mr Nat Sacof.

Nat was 87, when he died after a long illness, following an operation. During his younger days, Nat was always very involved in Shul affairs. He was a member of Council for many years, and held the office of Secretary.

During the first World War, Nat was a member of the Armed Services, and was taken prisoner by the Germans, and spent a considerable time in a prisoner of war camp.

Since those days he was a member of the British Legion, and became a founder member of the Poleck Branch.

Nat was always a great support to his dear wife, who has done, and is still doing so much for our Community.
