MESSAGE for PASSOVER 1982/5742

After having experienced the long severe winter season we Jewish People are looking forward to celebrate Pesach which is regarded as the most popular Festival in the Jewish calendar. It brings back to our mind the outstanding historical event of the Exodus of the Jewish People after having been enslaved by the Egyptian Dictators for 210 years. We have been witnessing in our time that the Jewish People are going through another Exodus by withdrawing from the Sinai Peninsular which Israel had conquered during the Six Day War. Let us hope that the completion of this Exodus will help to stabilise the peace contract with Egypt and the other countries in the Middle East.

Very soon we are getting ready for our celebration at the Seder Nights. We are sitting in a festive mood round our Seder table joined by our relatives and friends with the various kind of special dishes on our Seder plate. We are explaining to our children the meaning of our Passover celebration and stressing to them the importance that the history of the redemption of the Jewish People from Egypt has its great message to us in our present time as we are reciting it in our HAGGADAH with the following words. "FOR IT WAS NOT OUR ANCESTERS ALONE THAT THE HOLY ONE, BLESSED BE HE REDEEMED, HE ALSO DELIVERED US WITH THEM"

By celebrating our Seder in the old traditional way we are encouraging our children with the spiritual Seder of our Judaism, and we are bringing near the time when Jewish People will be able to live their free life even in the countries where they are still enslaved.

We hope P.G. to look forward to the great message of our HAGGADAH.
" V'NODEN L'CHA SHEH CHADASH AL G'ALATEINU V'AL P'DUD NAFSHENU
" WE SHALL THEN OFFER UNTO YOU A NEW SONG FOR OUR REDEMPTION AND SALVATION"
