BRISTOL ZIONIST SOCIETY.

Shalom! - and Shana Tova!

It doesn't seem a year since I wrote this last, but it is. We are starting off with a film show this year, and are obtaining three films from "Films of Israel". Details as follows:

Thursday, 21st October, at the Frank Cohen Hall, The Synagogue, Park Row, at 8.00 p.m.

GOLDA MEIR (22 mins., colour).

A film that not only reveals the character of Israel's modern-day matriarch, interviewed in 1973 when Prime Minister, but conveys an idea of the essence of the State itself. Mrs. Meir gives her personal views of the nature of the international community, in terms which have permanent validity. She explains the significance of Israel to the Jews of the world, the compatibility of loyalty to Israel with citizenship of a Diaspora country and the effort to build a Jewish society with social justice. Produced by the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith (1974).

MUSEUM ON THE HILL (28 mins., colour).

A delightfully interesting film about the Israel Museum in Jerusalem. Aptly described as "...a beacon shining on a Hill of Tranquility...", the Museum is also a bridge between East and West. Its exhibits from many lands include the famous Dead Sea Scrolls, housed in the Shrine of the Book, which is itself shaped to represent the jars containing the Scrolls. There are also works of modern Jewish artists, such as the late Anna Ticho. The archaeology department traces Man from his earliest beginnings. Its Judaica collection shows the common heritage shared by all Jews. Produced by Ferno Productions (1980).

UPROOTING TERROR (15 mins., colour).

Virtually partitioned between Syria and the P.L.O., Lebanon has become a world centre of terrorism and subversion. U.N. forces are ineffectual against terrorist infiltration. The Israel-Lebanon border, once peaceful, has become a place of violence. This short but powerful documentary illustrates vividly the effects of P.L.O. terrorism on life in border settlements, and offers clear justification for Israeli counter measures. Includes footage of P.L.O. training and underlines the link between the P.L.O. and international terror groups. Produced by I.D.F. Spokeman Film Unit (1980).
