FROM THE RECORDER 15 YEARS AGO

The news that Helen Bloom has again been returned to the City Council reminds us that the Jewish Community has the unusual distinction of having two sisters serving as City Councillors. Helen who has served for nine years in Municipal life, devotes her energies mainly to Education and Health matters. Since 1948, she has been a Governor of the United Bristol Hospitals and is Chairman of the House Committees of the Maternity and Childrens Hospitals, and has been appointed by the Minister of Health to serve on two National Committees investigating into important Health & Hospital matters.

Bert: Sacof the other sister, has served on the Bristol Education Committee for nearly nine years. Among many important offices, she is a Governor of Red Halls School, and Chairman of the Bristol Central Commercial School. Youth work is among her special interests. Mrs B. Sacof had the honour of being appointed Justice of the Peace in 1951 - being the first Jewish person for many years to be a Magistrate.
