BRISTOL RFP COUNCIL

Fxtract from remarks by Mr. Richard Cottrell MFP for Bristol, speaking at a meeting held in the Frank Coben Hall on 6th October.

Mr Cottrell, who had visited Israel a number of times, most recently this Summer, declared that too many of the facts about the Country's battle for survival were deliberately bistorted and misreprented.

There had probaly been no alternative to the operation in the Lebanon. Those in the United Kingdom who were creating an enormous clamour for Israel withdrawal were curiously silent on making the same demand of Syria!

He believed that the Furopean Community would become increasingly involved in the Middle Fast's affairs, and perhaps more wisely than had been the case in the past. Pressure from the Furopean Parliament on Greece to recognise Israel ic now enormous. At the same time the decision by the Community to freeze financial protocols with Israel at the time of the Debanon operation has proved to be a clumsy mistake.

The task that any Israel government now had to face - apart from continuing preparedness against attack - was that of the economy. Israelis had deluded themselves far to long that index linking would insulate them from feeling the pain of inflation. All the gains that the country was now making in the economic field were running to waste in the sands of rampant inflation.

STILL UNLIBERATED

With the return of Armistice Day, we who survived the war of 1939-1945, see with anger and shame how, in spite of the lives that were given, tyranny still makes misery. Equally, we take pride in the courageous humanity of those who stand firm. Yosef Begun, whose crime is to teach Hebrew without official consent (which has been refused) after having been denied permission to leave the U.S.S.R for Israel returns to prison and trial, undeterred by two previous penal sentances. He has now been sentanced to seven years prison and five years exile.

Pedro Aguerre is imprisoned by the military government which seized power in Uruguay in 1972, because he was a palotician of the Frente Amplio, the demonstratic coalition opposed to the military, still legal at the time of his membership. (Pedro Aguerre is one of twenty Uruguayan prisoners of conscience adopted by the Bristol West Group of Amnesty International).

At this time of the year, when we remember our war dead, those who saved us from Nazism, it is right that we should remember also those still suffering for freedom, such as Yosef Begun and Pedro Aguerra.
