BOARD OF DEPUTIES

Two important subjects were debated on Sunday 16th December 1984.

1. Mr Livingstone, GLC Leaders statement that the officers and members of the Board were neo-fascist.
By its nature, the statement is so absurd that comment is not necessary, but perhaps shows him in his true colours. The statement was unkind and hurt the whole Anglo - Jewish community. A public apology is called for - not only the withdrawal of the statement.

2. The following amendment to the Board's Constitution was discussed
' INSERT 'A' CLAUSE ATTACHED.

A long debate discussed the effect on the minority groups e.g. Progressive Jewry and the possibility of them withdrawing from the Board; the Ecclesiastical Authorities refers to the Chief Rabbi and the United Synagogue. It was felt that the United Synagogue would strengthen its hold on the Board even though minority groups could still ignore any direction. We are all Jews, even though inter-marriage and children of such a union do seem to have different interpretation by the United Synagogue and progressive organisations.

As stated the resolution was passed with some 60% majority with the hope, that in practice, there would be a 'status quo'.

BRISTOL TALMUD TORAH

After holding tuition fees steady for several years we must now regretfully make an increase to cover rising costs and, in particular, in order to give the teachers a long overdue and much deserved pay rise.

Accordingly, as from the start of the Spring term fees will be £1. per week for children of members of the Congregation and £1.50 per week for children of non members.

Until now, bills for tuition fees have always been paid annually in arrear, but we are now finding that this is affecting our cash flow position and it is therefore proposed that bills will be delivered every term, payable in arrear from now on. The next account, therefore, will be for two terms ending March 1985 and the following bill be sent at the end of the Summer term.
