I first got to know Sidney Bloom on my arrival in Bristol 24 years ago, when he came to my notice through his activities in Shul. My first impression of him stayed with me throughout, the combination of dignity and friendliness, the epitome of the Anglo-Jewish gentleman. Sidney's activities in Communal affairs, he was both Secretary and President, were combined with his wife Helen's activities in civic matters, a quite unique combination.

Among his many interests was a love of antiques, which we soon discovered we shared and this led to a growing and lasting friendship.

Although like so many of us, Sidney did not have the good fortune to be born in Bristol, he showed his interest from the beginning by being born in Praed St, Paddington, as close as one could possibly get to Bristol in the railway age. By marrying one of the Strimer Sisters he demonstrated his attachment to the City and the caring side of his life. His final illness was borne with great dignity and cheerfulness and one had the feeling that he was shielding one from his trauma rather than himself.

I feel his passing very much and shall miss him tremendously. I hope that Helen will take a little comfort from the fact that the thoughts by all of us are very much with her in her bereavement and wish her a life free from further trouble.
