MESSAGE FOR PURIM 1986/5746

There is no other event in the Jewish Calender which is so popular as the Festival of PURIM. It reminds us of one of the most serious situations in Jewish History when the entire Jewish population of Persia was condemned to be exterminated on the 13th.ADAR by the decree of HAMAN. The great heros of the Purim story, QUEEN ESTHER and MORDECHAI were prepared to sacrifice their lives to safeguard the Jewish People of Persia. The history of the Jewish People up to the Babylonian EXILE is filled out with miracles. In every generation a Jew could state his belief through miracles which he has seen himself. Surprisingly we don't find the name of G'd mentioned in the MEGILLAH. In spits of it the miracle of PURIM is a testimony that G'd was still ruling the happenings in the PURIM story. We are convinced that the election of ESTHIR as QUEEN OF PERSIA, also that MORDECHAI was discovering the plot which Bigson and Seresh were planning against the King, further what we find in the BOOK of ESTHER that KING AHASVEROUS had a sleepless night, which is explained by the MIDRASH that the ALMIGHTY was also disturbed in that night when he saw ISRAEL in such distress. All these facts are bringing clearly to our mind that the whole PURIM story was ruled by a DIVINE INTERVENTION.

In this connection we are coming to the conclusion that our individual daily life, and the life of the Jewish People in ISRAEL and all over the World, are guided under the divine protection of our daily miracles which are well expressed in the words of the AMIDAH

BRISTOL "200" 1786 - 1986

Most members of the Congregation will be aware that this year we are celebrating the BICENTENARY of the opening of the FIRST PERMENANT SYNAGOGUE IN BRISTOL SINCE THE EXPULSION OF 1290.

Not that this Congregation is not much older, it was founded around 1740, but we have no exact date.

In 1786 the Medineval WEAVERS HALL in TEMPLE STREET was beautifully fitted out as a Synagogue at the expense of LAZARUS JACOBS, the famous glass maker. Many fittings of this building survive, incorporated into our present Synagogue.

To commemorate this event, your Council appointed a Sub-Committee to plan our celebrations which it is hoped will take place later this year, and continue into 1987. The Sub-Committee consists of MINNIE KUSHNER, BENGIE WOLL and your PRESIDENT, and has been joined by ROBERT HURST.

The first of these events will be an EXHIBITION of CEREMONIAL OBJECTS, some specially made for the opening of the 1786 SYNAGOGUE, and other items illustrating the HISTORY of THE CONGREGATION.

This will take place in ST.NICHOLAS MUSEUM(a branch of the CITY MUSEUM and ART GALLERY) from AUGUST 29TH. for 4 weeks, and will be opened by the DEPUTY LORD MAYOR. Would anyone who has any object which they think may be of interest please contact me.

The second event will be a CIVIC SERVICE in the SYNAGOGUE on SUNDAY, 28TH. SEPTEMBER at 3.00P.M. The actual day of the BICENTENARY is the 22ND.ELLUL which this year as in 1786, is on a Friday (26th. September), but this is hardly a suitable day for a CIVIC SERVICE.

Other events are in a planning stage, notice will be given in the "RECORDER" once they have been finalized.

Funds raised by WOMENS JIA are channelled to the Jewish Agency in Jerusalem for use on vital human needs in the fields of immigration and absorption, youth care and training, pre-school and higher education and social welfare. British Jewry, through the JIA, makes a significant contribution to the quality of life of our people in Israel.
