ISRAEL'S KALEIDOSCOFTO CLIMATES by Vitschak Dinur

Israel's wide variety of climates is a boon for OLIM(new immigrants), tourists, and erop-growing industries. Tourists, and of course Israelis and Olim, have a large choice in the type of holiday they would like, and the climate that most appeals to them. And the country's varied climactic regions mean that numerous vegetable and fruit crops can be produced all year round. Vituehak Dieur takes a look at Israel's various climactic zones.

(WZPS) Scan travians, young and old, fill up the planes that bring them straight from their coud climan to the warm water and hot weather in EIIAT and the mineral-water baths et he Bead Sea. Israelis pack the Eilat area during the sehool holiday season () & August) and during Jowish holidays such as Passover and Suscon but they also enjoy bathing and water skiing at the Sea of falilee and the winter skiing on Mount Hormon.

Five Climattic Zones

Tiny Israel has a variety of climates comparable to the variety enjoyed by much larger countries such as the USA or Australia, that cover entire continents. Crossing from Tel Aviv via Jerusalem to the Dead Sea, a traveller passes through five different elimactic zones in a distance of about 100 kilometers. Eilat has a tropical elimate ideal for swimming and sunbathing all year round, whilst Mount Hermon has snow in winter and attracts skiers from all parts of the country. The Sea of Caliloe is very warm for most of the year, bringing swimmers and water-skiing onthusiasts to its fresh waters. The Fead Sea's dry heat and medicinal waters are an excellent cure for psoriasis, a skin discase, whilst the southern town of Arad is a climactic haven for asthma sufferers. Dwellers in the coastal plain love to come to Jerusalem, adjacent to the dry Judean Desert for its atmosphere, which is bracing in summer, brisk in winter, but parelyhumid or muggy. Many Jerusalemites, on the other hand, love to spend their holidays in the heat of the Dead Sea.

Climattic Structure and Crop Growing

Such a kaleidoscopic mixture of climates in one small country and the almost Fomplete absence of smog, explain why Israel is able to produce such a large Variety of vegatable and fruit crops. Some of these, such as tomatoes, are now produced all year round, at different times in different parts of the country. The varied climates enable cropplantings to be staggered in different regions so that their riponing season is extended. The heat in areas such as the Western Negev and the southern continuation of the Jordan Valley enable special early Srops of peppers, eggplant and tomatoes to be grown for export to European countries to Israel's financial advantage. Flowers also ripen at times that compliment those in Europe without competing, and some semi-tropical fruits, such as Avocado and Mango, are not grown thore at all. Israel's climate makes her Israel's climatic into a back garden for the tables of Europe. structure is closely connected with its location and physical structure. Fittingly for its geographical position at the eastern extremity of the Mediterranean, Israel has an extreme Mediterranean-type climate: winter is short and raisy and the rest of the year is clear and sunny, and temperatures are generally mild to semi-tropical. The coastal plain is warm and moist, while the hilly areas parallel to the coast and including Jerusalem are cooler on the average and have a drier atmosphere. The Jordan Valley, including Tiberius on the Sea of Galilee, and its continuation, the Arava down to Eilat is hot and dry. Milat and the Bet Shear Valley south of the Sea of Galilee have semi-tropical elimates. The raniest place (and one of the coldest) is Israel, is Safed, which is only a short distance from balmy Tiberias. Because the rainy winter season is so short, it is important that sufficient rain should fall in a short time. There can be strong winds, but there are no hurroanes or typhoons, though rare insursions of air from Siberia and Middle Asia are bitingly cold. Some snow falls most years in Safed, Jerusalem and the peaks of the Judean hills, with heavy snow fall on Mount Hermon in the north. Israelis sometimes suffer the offects of occasionally stiflingly hot winds from the direction of the Red Sea. This phenomenon is called a "sharav" and is the result of air subsiding over the country becoming compressed and heated. No one has seriousely suggested that different climates ereate different tamperaments, but most agree that a good climate is a definate advantage in

life. Israel's generally balmy climates are a major contributing factor to the quality of life it offers its residents, and one of the main attractions for

people coming to live and spend time in the Holy Land.
