### THE PERFECT RABBI

Courtesy of Walter Rothschild in Sinai Chronicle (Leeds Reform) translated from a Dutch Jewish Newsletter in turn translated from an Australian paper.

"Results of a computer survey show that the perfect rabbi delivers a sermon of precisely fifteen minutes. He attacks sin, but makes sure that no one is upset.

He works from 8am to midnight, and also acts as Shammas. He earns £40 per week, is smartly dressed, buys good books, drives a good Car and gives £40 per week to charity. He is 28 years old, and has 30 years' experience.

He is filled with a passionate desire to work with the youth, and gives all of his time and attention to the older members of the community. The perfect rabbi is always smiling, in an earnest manner. He has a constant feeling for humour, which helps him remain serious in his work.

He visits, daily, fifteen families in the Community, plus prisoners and invalids in hospital. He spends his whole time trying to attract members from amongst the uncommitted Jews, and he is always in the office whenever he is needed.

If your rabbi does not match these specifications, send this letter to six other communities who also lack a perfect rabbi. Pack up your rabbi and send him to the community at the top of the list. Within a week you will receive 1,643 rabbis, of which one at least must be perfect.

Believe in this letter! One congregation broke the chain and received its old rabbi back again within three months."

### THE SPIRO STUDY GROUP

For the 1989 Summer Term we have what should be a fascinating series of four talks to be given by Mr Howie Jacobson from the Spiro Institute in London, under the title:

From Temple to Synagogue: Aspects of a Jewish Revolution.

May 10th: Temple and Synagogue in a Vacuum
What are the differences and similarities? What is their
relationship: Evolutionary? Revolutionary? Complementary? What
is the archeological, literary and inscriptional evidence?

May 24th: The Wider World
Was Judaism in late antiquity influenced by Graeco-Roman
magical beliefs and astrology? How "paganised" were the rabbis
of the Mishna and Palistinian Talmud? What were the effects of
Graeco-Roman beliefs on synagogue art, architecture and ritual?
Why is the Zodiac a common decoration on synagogue floors?

June 7th: The Unnamed Enemy
What was the effect of the rise and triumph of Christianity on
the self-understanding of Jewish communities? Was the
development of Jewish messianism influenced by Christianity? Is
Christian influence reflected in synagogue architecture? Why
did Julian the Apostate (from Christianity!) try to rebuild the
Jewish Temple? Why is there no mention of this episode in the
Talmud? How did the Jewish masses respond? How even was the
fight between Christianity and Judaism? Were they competing for
pagan converts?

June 21st: The Lost Voices
What does the historical evidence indicate about the varieties of Jewish practice, self-understanding and self-expression in the formative years of rabbinic Judaism? Did the rabbis whose views have been preserved in the Mishna and Talmud represent a tiny segment of Jewish society? If so, why did they "win"? What is the legacy of this period for the development of rabbinic Judaism? Are there any "lessons" to be learned today about "assimilation" and exclusiveness?

All meetings will be held in the Frank Cohen Hall and start at 8.00 pm. The cost for the series will be £12 (£3 per session) and it would be helpful if the whole sum could be paid in advance - though this should not, please, deter anyone who would prefer to pay for each session on the night. (If you would like to add a donation to study group funds, this would be very welcome - I suggest a maximum of £3). ### 'REFLECTIONS'

As I look back on my 'three score years and ten', I feel rather sad at times. Life has gone by so quickly for me with all its riches, experiences, and surprises. I also miss so much the old 'characters' and personalities who have all gone now, and with them an ability to laugh at ourselves. Pondering over those times I realise how dull and uniform we have become. It seems to me the main cause is affluence, and I do not exclude myself from my "condemnation".

When I was young, living in Liverpool, the Community was rich in "one off" character for example "Max the Pipka"-h was the only Jew in town who smoked a pipe! There was "Blind Dukie", who felt his way along the side of a tram to find the doorway, but who could spot an Ace of Spades from 50 yards away! An exageration no doubt, but so were all these characters, and larger than life. But, they are all gone now, never to be replaced with their like, giving way to attitudes, and diaries and conformity.

But, on reflection, maybe there is another factor. In the larger Communities there has been an explosion of Orthodoxy, which in my opinion has a smothering effect. In the PINKAY OVOTH that we recite on SHABBAT afternoon, is a phrase "MAKE A FENCE AROUND THE LAW". I ask myself, why a fence? Why not a wall to protect the LAW" After all, a wall is permenant, but if we look at the Berlin wall for instance, this not only keeps ideas in, and originality out, but it imprisons those ideas within. To expand on the theme, a fence is less solid-the implication being that there should be an 'osmosis' of learning and ideas passing through inwards and outwards This stremses the fact that the Religion is so strong it does not need a wall to enclose it, but a fence through which it flows out to the world.

I wonder if some of our leaders today, are trying to build a wall around the TORAY confining us to uniformity, and encouraging the Ghetto attitude with all its accompanying isolation and segregation.

These are my thoughts on my Birthday, and I would appreciate a response from other readers, with their thoughts on my comments, perhaps in the next issue.


