YOMIM NORAYIM

SECURITY

All members and their families are asked to be particularly security conscious before, during and after the Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services.

There will be a rota for gate duty, as in previous years, and you are asked to take your place on this rota as and when requested (usually two men at a time), even though your turns may come at moments you might prefer not to be out of shul. Those on gate duty will be responsible for the key, and to hand it over to the next people coming on duty. **N.B. The door is to be kept locked, the key in the lock, on the inside.** The gatekeepers should remain close to the gate, to watch over the key, to let in those arriving, and also to ensure safe exit in case this is needed in emergency. If the gatekeepers are uncertain about letting someone in, that person should be asked to wait while one of the gatekeepers seeks advice.

Will everyone please:

- report to a member of council any person or object in or around the shul that arouses your suspicion;
- be helpful to the gatekeepers, identifying yourself and those accompanying you, if you are not already known;
- not congregate on the outer steps or the pavement;
- be aware of the emergency exits which are:

(a) by the door in the left/north ladies gallery, up along the bridge and passage, then left and through the emergency gate to the next door garden;

(b) via the downstairs back lobby, up the short flight of back stairs, through the emergency door, up the slope and through the gate to the next door garden;

(c) through the door at the far corner of the Frank Cohen Hall directly into the next door garden. This door should be used only in case of real emergency, as it involves breaking the glass to undo the bolt.

Having dealt with the necessary and not very pleasant business of security, the security officers wish you all a Happy New Year and well over the Fast.


