

Closed for the Jewish Holidays

I do understand that living in and being involved with the Bristol Jewish Community, at times it is easier to let things pass, ignore the unpleasant and not get involved in communal bickering, but I feel I must make a point on behalf the women of the Synagogue Guild and therefore the women of this community.

On the nights of Friday 13th and Saturday 14th October, women members of the community turned up for the services, to make Kiddush in the Succoh(which incidentally had been erected by one member and her husband and had been decorated by three women of the Community) to find, unfortunately, that none of our Executive or Council had turned up to unlock the gates or hold a service. As I understand it, on the Saturday night even Council members turned up with their families, expecting to take part in a service.

Whilst Succot is supposed to be a happy, festive occasion, the congregants who turned up, (6 men, 5 children and 3 women) were neither happy nor festive for obvious reasons.

We do realise that people have other committments, go on holidays, have outside interests etc., but although both these services were advertised in the festival time:-table issued with the September Recorder the only public reference made to the cancellation of services was the Vice-President's casual mention on Shabbat that although the service was advertised that he did not "think" there was a service that night. This remark was less than positive and of no help to the congregants who turned up on the Saturday night.

Sorry chaps - this is just not good enough. We feel that the women of the community have upheld their tradition of ensuring that we have all the requisite ingredients to make a nice kiddush in the Succoh over the festival, therefore, gentlemen we expect you to supply the services.

In either case each nominee must be seconded and have agreed to stand.

Dear Editors.

We've had our Simchat Torah and - even allowing for my not wholly impartial viewpoint as one on the Chatanim - what a joyful rejoicing in the Law it was. With Jonathan Gorsky in such excellent form, with our lively group of students and visiting Israelis, with a sprinkling of whiskey...perhaps these were the ingredients.

But what moved me most during the evening was seeing the women find a way (and perhaps the confidence) to participate more fully - in singing, in dancing, in reaching forward to touch and kiss the passing Sifrim Torah. And the following morning, after a "reminder" called from somewhere, it was the girls as well as the boys who stood on the bimah for the final mitzvah before the Chatan Torah.

Maybe those young girls on the bimah will have a belief in the possibility that a spiritual involvement in Judaism is for them too. Maybe those teenage and young women who danced and sung in front of the Ark will see a spark of hope that Judaism is something worth participating in as more than spectator activity, which is hardly enough to attract them to shul. Maybe those women who kissed the Sifrim Torah will sense the possibility of some form of inclusion rather than what is for many spiritual exclusion.

The Haftarah on Simchat Torah was the beginning of the book of Joshua. Three times the divine word to Joshua, later said to him by the people also, is Chazak Ve-ematz. I want to repeat that exhortation to those women to hold their confidence: "Be strong and of great courage".

This is not an altruistic call for the sake only of those women who are feeling the need for a greater spiritual participation. I believe that for men too, such participation by women, to the extent they wish it and to the extent permitted by Halacha, can add richness to our prayer and practice of ritual - including the richness of heart. And I believe our small community will be truly healthy and vibrant if we hold the involvement of all our young people, women as well as men.
