BRISTOL HEBREW CONGREGATION AGM 1989

This year's annual general meeting was one for the record books. A record number of people came and participated in the discussion. A record number of candidates stood for election to Council. And the meeting lasted a record - within recent memory - four and a half hours.

Your scribe's notetaking hand has still to recover. A fuller account of the major topics discussed will appear in the February Recorder. This note is restricted to announcing the election results.


Our new President is Bob Emmanuel. He takes over from Raphael Emanuel, who received not one but two well deserved votes of thanks for his lengthy tenure of the congregation's presidency. Raphael steps - as it were - into Bob's shoes as Vice-President. The two other Honorary Officer positions continue to be ably filled by Andrea Hutter as Secretary and Arnold Greenwood as Treasurer.

The election for 'ordinary' members of Council produced some surprises and an unexpected cliffhanger. Not everyone could win, so we hope that those who were not elected do not feel too disappointed and will stand another year. Thanks were particularly given to last year's Council members who have resigned - Colin Berkovitch and Lionel Caplan - and to Harold Seymour.

The current Council, Officers apart, comprises: John Adler, David Baum, Alan Elkan, Anthony Elman, Gerald Gee, Alf Glick, Tony Gordon, Jonathan Hutter, Min Kushner, Sam Silverman, Lawrence Trackman, Martin Vegoda, and Bencie Woll. The observant reader will have counted thirteen instead of the 'constitutional' twelve names. Therein lies the cliffhanger. As a substitute for a tie-break, a hastily convened Executive Committee decided to co-opt a thirteenth member where two candidates had received the same number of votes in twelth place. Council will surely ratify this decision of Solomon.

Finally, the Council is Joined by its three ex-officio members: Sheila Tobias as Chair of the Guild, Gerald Levy for the Talmud Torah, and Henry Springer representing the Chevra Kadisha.

This 'for the time being' note cannot end without recording one other major agm decision. In the new calendar year we shall welcome Michael Morris as Bristol Hebrew Congregation's part-time Minister, alongside his other role as student chaplain for the south west. Provided, that is, that all the other decision making for his appointment ends satisfactorily. BRISTOL JEWISH WELFARE SOCIETY

Mr.W. Schlesinger has just retired as the Treasurer of the Society, many people did not know or appreciate the work that he did.

Bill, first joined the Bristol Board of Jewish Guardians in 1947. In 1953, the Bristol Board of Jewish Guardians and the Benevolent Society of Hebrew Ladies amalgamated to form the new Bristol Jewish Welfare Society, with Mrs G. Sacof and Mr.E. Morris at the helm.

In 1958 Mr Schlesinger was appointed case worker, replacing Mrs Sacof who could no longer travel.

In 1980, Bill became Treasurer, taking over from Mr Morris who had left the town.

During his time as Treasurer and case worker, Bill interviewed persons requiring assistance, visited prisoners in Leyhill, and made frequent visits to the Old Aged home in Cardiff on behalf of the Community, all in his own time on a unpaid voluntary basis.

May 1 on behalf of the Welfare Society say 'Thank You' Bill, for all the work that you have done over the past 40 years helping people in need.
