#### The Congregation's AGM on 3 December 1989

Last month's Recorder carried an account of the AGM elections. What that left out - unforgivably - was any acknowledgement of thanks to Sam Nirenberg for his service on Council during the year as representative of the Chevra Kadisha. We've since learnt too that we should have resolved our tie for twelth place by holding a fresh election among the two tie-place candidates. Does that mean we can set a new time record next year? Be prepared to come with energy-restoring refreshments.

Before the exciting elections, the major items aired were:- summarising Council [and AGM] meetings in the Recorder,
supported almost unanimously

- approving the appointment of Michael Morris as BHC parttime Minister, alongside his post as Student Chaplain for the Western Region - another unanimous decision
- the desirability of greater face-to-face contact and twoway liaison with our Board of Deputies representative
- proposals to raise membership subscriptions: great concern was expressed at the suggested disproportionate increase for single members compared with family members; the outcome was acceptance of a resolution that family membership be £180 and single membership £100
- proposals to develop the top part of the synagogue site, provided suitable sources of finance can be found
- the success of the synagogue shop.

This very brief summary cannot do justice to the breadth of the reports presented and the depth of subsequent discussion. Be sure to come to the 1990 AGM and hear the minutes read in full - all eleven pages! - since we also decided not to vary this traditional practice.

#### Council meeting held on 28 December 1989

Major items discussed at the last Council meeting were:-

- how to create much needed extra communal space for meetings, classes, the shop, etc in the synagogue buildings
- the need for a clear and properly costed security policy and volunteer security officers
- the need to plan to meet the welfare needs of elderly congregants
- proposals for increasing the yearly lottery contributions and monthly draw prizes
