Today, 27th of Nissan, is the Memorial Day for the six million Jews who found their tragic death under the beastful hands of the Nazis in the Second World War. But this day will also be marked as a very sad day for our Jewish Community here, in Bristol.

It was so painful to realise that only seven men and eight women actually remembered and found it necessary and appropriate to come to Schul and take part in this very special service. All of them saw the pain and bitterness in Sam Nirenberg's eyes, for there wasn't even a Minyan for Kaddish!

Six million Jews died for being Jews, and we, the Jews of today, the survivors, can't even spend an hour from our time to show our respects!!

Is there any excuse for why people from our Community couldn't spare their time?! We had all the ideal conditions to make it as convenient as possible for <u>all</u> members of the Community to participate; A Sunday morning - which is, for most of us, a non-working day, no faith or belief in any sort of G-od required, only the need to remember the most horrific massacre in the worlds' history, and also the need to know and inherit this to our children so they can tell the next generations!

The way in which we recognise this day and its significance in our contemporary Judaism could be argued, but once a decision has been made, we, as members of this Community should follow it.

I hope that this harsh letter will initiate a deep discussion among the members of our Community, and this will bring up some new and improved ideas about how we should (if it is really necessary for us to do so) recognise this day and pass the knowledge onto the following generations.

SPIRO STUDY GROUP

Summer Term 1990

I am pleased to announce that the programme for the summer term will be a series of lectures by Dr Jonathan Broido on Judaism, Christianity and Islam. There will be particular reference to the historical period during which the "daughter religions" emerged, with an exploration of how and why the splits took place, a comparison of the religions, and the significance for Jews of the events of that period.

Dr Broido currently lectures at the Spiro Institute in London. He received his PhD at Pittsburg and has lectured in Philosophy and Jewish thought in Israel (Bar-Ilan, Ben-Gurion and Hebrew Universities) and the United States. He is currently engaged in an interdisciplinary study of communication and the interaction between diverse cultural groups.

The talks this term will take place in the Bannerman Road Synagogue, on Wednesdays May 9th and 23rd, June 5th and 20th, with probably a fifth meeting on July 4th. The meetings will start promptly at 8.00 pm - this is important as the speaker will be returning to London after each meeting.

The fee will be £3 per meeting. It would be helpful if, on the first night (when the number of meetings will be known) members register and pay for the full series, though it will of course be possible to pay for each meeting as attended.

I understand that Dr Broido is a very stimulating speaker, and I look forward to seeing not only all our regulars, but many newcomers also. You will be very welcome.
