IMMEDIATE NEEDS

In responding to the immediate needs of new olim, the Jewish Agency is having to spend $\mathfrak{t}_{1,000,000}$ per night. The Jewish Agency can no longer afford to wait months from the time pledges are made until they are fully paid up. It must have the cash in hand to help all immigrants in the initial stages of their absorption.

The oleh's first days in Israel are crucial to the success of his/her absorption. Olim taking the direct absorption route have to rent an apartment, buy provisions, pay for utilities and register chidren in school. THEY NEED THE SUPPORT OF THE ENTIRE JEWISH WORLD.

On JUNE 13th, it was announced that 50,000 clim have arrived in Israel so far

Predictions are that Israel expects 150,000 - 180,000 clim to arrive by the end of this year, and somewhere between 450,000 to 500,000 within the next three years.

Chairman of the Jewish Agency Simcha Dinitz has revealed, that from July, Israel can expect some 20,000 Soviet olim per month.

Pinland is to serve as the fourth major transit point for Soviet Jews en route to Israel, along with Hungary, Romania and Poland.

According to data collected, 81% of Jews in L@ningrad have experienced antisemetic incidents in the last six months, and a staggering 94% feared pogroms.

According to Foreign Ministry General Reuven Merhav, the remainder of the Ethiopian Jewry, estimated at 17,000, will arrive in Israel within the year. Most Ethipian Jews have left their homes and are heading towards the capital, Addis Ababa, hoping to take advantage of the family reunification agreement signed recently. Hundreds of Jews have found initial refuge in two huge tents in the heavily guarded couryard of the Israel Embasay in Ababa.

BRISTOL JEWRY, search your consciences, dig deep into your pockets to help our brothers and sisters in Israel shoulder this absorption.
