Notice to Congregants:- Shabbat Services.

The late finish of the Shabbat Morning Services which has been occurring for some months has given cause for concern and has been a subject for discussion by the Religious Affairs Committee on more than one occasion.

At the last meeting of the R.A. Committee held on November 1st, it was decided that in order to finish at a more reasonable time, that the Sephor Torah should be taken from the Ark at 10.30. and that Mussaph service begin not later than 11.45. This would mean that the Morning service should end at about 12.15.

The committee believes that if this schedule is adhered to it would mean worshippers would have to be in the Synagogue a little earlier than at the present time.

REPORT FROM COUNCIL MEETING - NOVEMBER 22nd

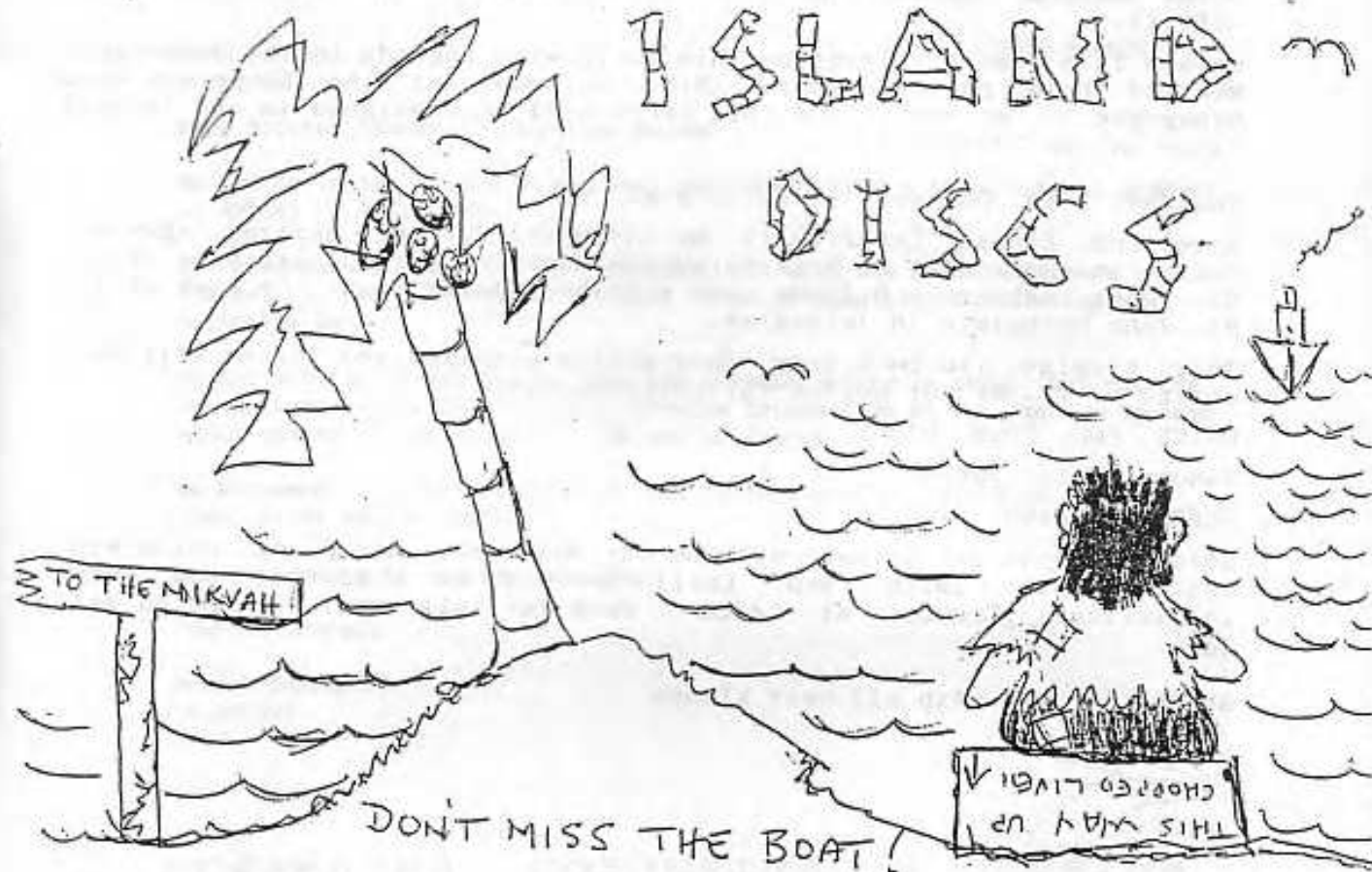
1. Laurence Trackman gave a presentation on the progress of the Top Site Redevelopment Working Party. A report will be given at the AGM.
