Recipe of the month : PIZZA - Judi Back

Dough - 12 ozs self-raising flour 1 level teaspoon salt
 2 ozs butter or margarine 2 ozs grated cheese
 under $\frac{1}{2}$ pint milk

Method - Put flour and salt in a basin - rub in the butter/margarine. Stir in the cheese and add the milk, using a fork. Mix to a rough dough, then knead until smooth. Roll out to $\frac{1}{8}$ " thickness. The dough can be frozen, in which case it should be taken out of the freezer one hour before use. Place on a greased baking tin.

Topping- Two large tins of tomatoes, strained and sieved. Add tomato puree, pepper, salt, paprika and mixed herbs. Put this mixture on the

dough, and add grated cheese. Decorate with capers and/or anchovies. Cook in an oven at 375° electric, or gas equivalent, until browned (anything from 10 to 30 minutes depending on the oven) - keep checking.
