Likewise, Ladies, whenever you are attending a service, please have your heads covered. However, should you arrive without a suitable head covering, the chairman of the Ladies Guild or any other lady will be only too pleased to lend you a scarf.

And finally to everyone, when you enter or re-enter while a service is in progress, remember that the other congregants may be standing in silent prayer, so it would be

courteous, to say the least, to wait until everyone is seated before entering.

To enhance the service and not cause distraction or disturbance, you are also requested to wait until the Ark is closed before going to your seat.

As so many visitors comment on the wonderful warmth and friendliness of our services, it would be a shame if we were unable to derive a deep spiritual feeling because of the lack of decorum.

FROM THE FINANCIAL REPRESENTATIVE

Dear Member,

I am writing to explain the new fee of £47.50 which will be operative from this Rosh Hashanna.

The synagogue fee may be broken down as follows:-

Membership	£16.00
Building Fund	£13.00
Funeral Expenses Scheme	£ 7.00
Religious Education Rate	£ 5.00
United Synagogue	£ 4.00
Additional Education Levy	<u>£ 2.50</u>
TOTAL:	<u>£47.50</u>

In addition this year there will be a voluntary levy of £2.00 for the Board of Deputies.

Out of each £47.50 the synagogue collects we only retain £29.00. Thus with a membership of about 200 we have an income of £5,800 per annum. Of this £3,000 is committed to repayments for the loans on our buildings. This leaves £2,800 to pay for all our other expenses such as heating (£1,000), Secretary, Caretaker, etc.

As you can imagine, this is a very tight budget, (even with the additional fund raising undertaken by the functions committee) and I appeal to all members to help us by paying their forthcoming bills as promptly as possible.

The Fast of the 9th of Av. This is more of a major than a minor fast since it commemorates:

- a) The Destruction of both the First and the Second Temples (586 B.C.E. and 70 C.E.).
- b) The fall of Bethar in the Bar Kochba rebellion (135 C.E.).
- c) In later centuries other sad occurrences were associated with this day; perhaps the most tragic is the Expulsion of the Jews from Spain in 1492.

The severity of the 9th of Av equals that of the Day of Atonement in that both fast days commence on the previous evening. The synagogue presents a gloomy appearance, for the lights are dimmed, the curtain is removed from the Ark and the worshippers sit on low stools or on the floor. Kinot (Prayers of lamentation) are recited and The Book of Lamentations is read. The Tallit and Tephillin are not worn during the morning service, instead they are worn in the afternoon service. Only essential work is permitted.

THE KINOT - These prayers tell of the glory that was Israel's and the martyrdom undergone by our ancestors who gave their lives for their Faith. There are some 40 Kinot many of which were composed by Yehuda Halevi (1085-1140) the renowned Spanish-Jewish poet.

The Editor has asked Philip Skelker, a member of the Synagogue and a local schoolteacher, to write a column in the Newsletter. Here is his first contribution.

A few months ago "The Jewish Chronicle" published an article about the admission of Jewish pupils at a number of independent schools, and it raised the question of the quota, the system by which Jewish entry is regulated, which operates at some of these schools. It seems to me that a quota is justified in a school whose character is determined by its religious allegiance. One has only to think of our own Jewish schools to see that such a school's raison d'etre could be endangered were it accessible to large numbers of pupils who not only did not share its religious values but also held beliefs positively at variance with those enshrined in the school's articles of foundation. The presence of a quota for social reasons - as a means of measuring the traditional clientele that its ethos remains the same - seems to me contemptible. Yet I wonder if we are right to seek the removal of such quotas by legislation. Parents with dignity and with the welfare of their children at heart will reject such a school and the most thoughtful and most dedicated staff of any denomination will eschew it. We should be relieved Jewish children escape a school of such narrow vision. I would not want my children to attend such schools and I do not believe that schools whose mode of determining entry is social acceptability have much of a future.

One of the many independent schools which receive Jewish pupils gladly is Habedashers' School, and I was delighted to learn that from next September Jewish instruction will be given to the Jewish boys there. The Headmaster is concerned that his Jewish boys come to a better understanding of what it means to reach their religious majority, to become Barmitzvah. This news confirms my experience as a pupil, as a student and as a schoolmaster that the non-Jewish world will respond to the serious and committed Jew by giving him facilities to practise his faith. Jewish parents, far from deliberately sending their children to schools which insist on a sacrifice of Jewishness as a condition of entry, should be requesting the heads of the schools their children attend to grant their children opportunities for Jewish assembly and instruction. There are many agencies in the Jewish community which are only too happy to help with this, and I should be pleased to provide names and addresses to any member of the Synagogue who is interested. Of course the best way to ensure that your child's school is sympathetic is to show that you care deeply about your faith. Your children's teachers will see whether or not you do by the attitudes and actions of your offspring. I should like to think that all of us will do all we can to see that those of our children who attend non-Jewish schools have every opportunity to enjoy and enrich their Jewishness.

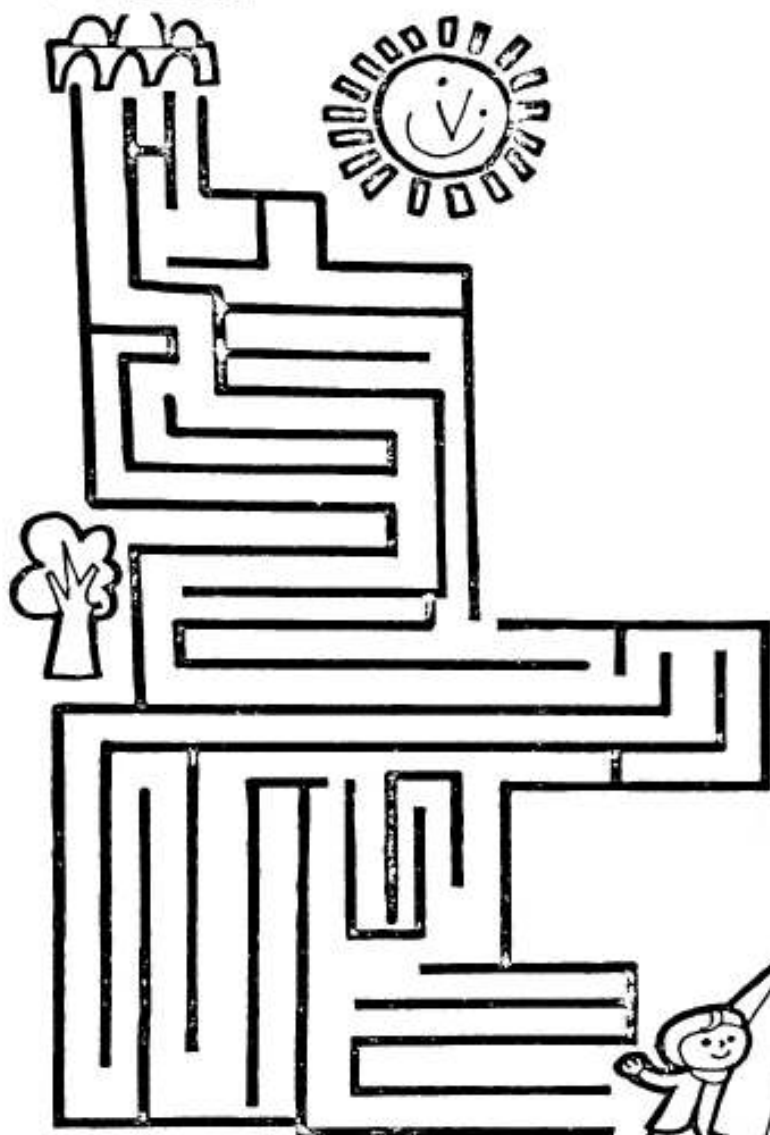

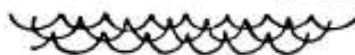

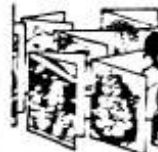
