from the 'wardens'box

We have now had sufficient donations to enable us to buy Mezuzot for both the Synagogue and the School Lane premises. Our thanks to those of you who responded so generously.

In these times of general economic difficulty the job of keeping the Synagogue solvent is even harder than usual. We have to pay our bills: the gas, electricity and telephone people do not want to be told "our members have not paid yet". Please - at the risk of being repetitive - pay your Synagogue Fees promptly: and help us to keep any future increase in fees to a minimum by taking out, or updating an existing Covenant and enabling us to get the benefit of a tax refund.

The matter of Covenants is of such importance that we now have two Covenant Officers: Allan Conway (950 6602) and Leon Mitchell (950 5496). May we invite you to telephone either of them in order to sort out Youk Covenant position.

of our current fees of £47.50, we retain a nett figure of £29.00. £40.50 of the gross fee is Covenantable, and this would give us an additional nett income of about £16.65 by way of tax refund. We need this money, and if we cannot get it by way of Covenant benefit, then we shall have to get it through even greater fee increases than would otherwise be necessary.

QUESTION:

Now that the School Lane premises have been refurbished, what is the next project?

ANSWER:

The next project, in terms of the Synagogue's premises, is the beautification of the Shul and the Beth Hamidrash. To this end, the Board have asked Johnny Back to chair a Buildings Development Committee whose brief will include the internal improvement of the buildings as well as site development.

This Committee will be submitting to the Board a list of items required, and these could then be the subject of donations by members.

QUESTION:

At the A.G.M. in May, it was announced that the Honorary Officers were investigating the appointment of a minister. What progress has been made? Who will select him? What qualities will you be looking for? What will it cost each member?

ANSWER:

The Honorary Officers have had a meeting with the Officers of the United Synagogue who have agreed, in principle, to our Community's need for a Minister.

The procedure for selection of a full-time Minister is laid down by the United Synagogue in the Bye-Laws. The position would be advertised, and the resultant applicants would be considered by a ministerial Appointments Committee which the United Synagogue would set up and on which our three Honorary Officers would sit. Not more than four candidates considered to be most suitable for the post would then be referred to our own Selection Committee, which would consist of the full Board of Management and ten other male members of the Synagogue. These ten members would be elected to sit on the Selection Committee in a similar manner to the way in which the board of Management is elected. If, for some reason, the number of nominations to the Selection Committee should be less than ten, then the Board of Management shall have the right to co-opt members to fill the remaining vacancies.

Each member of the Selection Committee will probably be looking for different qualities in the prospective Minister but almost certainly the most necessary attributes will be an ability to communicate with people and to provide the much needed spiritual leadership for our Community.

The Officers of the United Synagogue are preparing various figures for consideration by our board of hanagement relating to the financial implications of appointing a minister. Only after we have had a chance to look at these figures, and to make any possible counter-suggestions to the United Synagogue, will we know the scale of increase in our fees. It is hoped that any such increase will be kept to a minimum and will be introduced by a number of smaller increments rather than one large jump.

QUESTION:

How can I help in a practical, but not necessarily financial, way with the development of our congregation?

ANSWER:

The practical help that members can give can be broken down into religious, social and administrative.

Come along to our Services, and bring your Family: the more you become familiar with what is happening in Shul the more you will enjoy it. This is of particular relevance to the children.

Support the various functions, both big and small, social, intellectual and fund-raising, which are put on by the different groups in the Community. The Functions Committee, the Youth and Education Committee and the Ladies Guild will all be delighted to welcome new members.

Help our Membership Officer and our Covenant Officers to "sign up" new members and then to get the maximum return, by way of tax refund, out of the membership fees.

CHANUKAH

1. Purpose

When Palestine came under Syrian-Greek rule in 175 B.C.E. the Jews were persecuted and forbidden to practise their ancient faith. This led to a revolt instigated by an aged priest Mattathias, who, together with his sons and a poorly armed band of followers attempted to overthrow the enemy. After years of fighting, the Jews were temporarily successful and drove out the enemy. hattathias had died in the meantime and his son Judah, better known as "The Maccabean" (from the initial on his banner) carried on the struggle. In celebration of the defeat of the enemy and the re-dedication of the desecrated Temple the Jews celebrate the Festival of Chanukah ("Dedication").

2. Date

Chanukah is celebrated for eight days from the 25th. of Kislev - this year 17th December (1st candle to be lit on the evening of 16th December).

3. Names

An ingenious suggestion gives added significance to the term which when divided into two parts makes (they rested) (on the 25th). b) The Festival of Lights, a name which describes the main feature of the Festival.

4. Observance

Commencing on the 25th. of kislev candles are kindled to proclaim the miracle of the Temple lights, when the cruse of oil containing only enough oil to last for one day sufficed for eight days, thus keeping alight the 7717 or Candelabrum of the Temple.

- a) The lights are kindled as follows:
 - On the first night the light on the right of the lamp is kindled. On the second night an extra light is added on the left and so on for eight nights. It is customary to have an extra light which acts as "snammash" or attendant light, with which to kindle the others. On friday evening the Chanukah lights are lit before the Sabbath candles and on the termination of the sabbath, they are lit after navdalah.
- b) In the Synagogue: hights are kindled in the Synagogue as well as in the home. Extra prayers are recited.
- c) In the nome:

 The lights should be lighted near a window or doorway in order that the commemoration of the miracle should be made public.

 It a popular hyan sung

after the kindling of the lights and from the initial letters of the verses is said to have been composed by a certain hordecai. Parties are arranged for the children and gifts or "Chanukah gelt" (Chanukah money) distributed to them. Various games based on the story of Chanukah are played, the most popular of which is played with a "Dreidel" a small spinning "put and take" top on the sides of which are written the Hebrew letters "" indicating the phrase

called to the keading of the law?

On hearing your Hebrew name called, go to the reader's desk by the shortest route and without passing between the desk and the ark.

The reader will point to the first word of "your" portion which you should touch with the fringes of your tallit, kissing them after.

Hoding both handles of the scroll and with your feet together, say the first blessing without looking down at the Sefer Torah. Remember to pause after the first phrase to allow the congregation to respond, after which you repeat it and then commence boruch btoh etc. etc.

The reader will commence the reading during which you should continue to hold the scroll's right handle with your right hand.

Remember to follow the reading as it is being done on your behalf.

When "your" reading is over, touch the last word with the fringes, kiss them, roll the scroll together (it will then be covered) and say the final blessing.

kemain on the bimah while the next man is called, the Mishaberach is said for you and during the next reading. When your colleague has completed his final blessing, leave the bimah returning to your seat from the opposite side that you came up.

Congratulations to Laurence Brass on being elected a local Councillor as the result of a by-election.

SOLUTION TO BRIDGE PROBLEM

When this hand occurred the declarer allowed the queen of spades to win the first trick, won the spade continuation and took the diamond finesse which lost to North's king. North returned a spade facing out East's second stopper. Declarer then had eight tricks and played a heart to develop a ninth. However, South won the ace of hearts and cashed two spade tricks to defeat the contract. This was the full deal:-

NORTH

Spades 963 Hearts 86542 Diamonds K3 Clubs K95

WEST

Spades 75
Hearts Q3
Diamonds AQJ1075
Clubs AJ2

EAST

Spades AK2 Hearts KJ10 Diamonds 984 Clubs 10876

SCUTH


Spades QJ1084 Hearts A97 Diamonds 62 Clubs Q43

If declarer had counted his tricks he would have realised that if the diamond finesse lost he would need a heart trick. It was essential to knock out South's possible entry while declarer still had a spade stopper. Therefore, after winning the second spade, declarer should play the jack of hearts. If South wins and clears the spades the diamond finesse can be taken with safety into the North hand.


