

# From the Hon. Offs.

#### CUR LADIES

Over the last few years there has been some movement among Jewish women to obtain recognition and representation on orthodox Synagogue's Boards of Management. Bushey has been no exception.

As a result of a request by the Ladies Guild for greater representation at Board meetings for the ladies of our community, and after much deliberation at Board level, it has been decided that as from the next AGM of the Synagogue in May, 1981, there will be three non-voting lady observers at our monthly Board meetings.

At the AGM members of the Synagogue and their wives will be invited to elect two of these observers as representatives of the ladies of the community. The third observer will be the representative of the Ladies Guild and will be elected by the Guild itself.

We feel confident that Bushey's ladies will make the most of this opportunity to make this further contribution to the work which they do in the community.

#### SECURITY

Since the last edition of the Newsletter, the neo-nazi factions in this country and throughout Europe and the world, have made the headlines. Warning signals have been sounded for many years but only recently have Jews and non-Jews realised the extent of the problem.

There will always be those who say too little is done to protect ourselves and our communal buildings, those who accuse those concerned of over-reacting, those who cannot believe that it could happen to them and those who refuse to believe it happens at all. With heads well out of the sand, your Board have

introduced a number of security measures and intend tightening up wherever possible. This may cause some slight inconvenience but we are sure that everyone will be tolerant and recognise the possible disasters if we relax or are complacent.

#### NEW YEAR SERVICES

The High Holyday service arrangements . presented the Board with bigger headaches than ever this year yet through the tremendous cooperation of members and their families, problems were kept to a minimum. Nevertheless, there are, we are sure, areas for improvement and it would be interesting and instructive to hear of any constructive suggestions. It is no good getting annoyed on the day and just letting it out on your wife/ husband/child/dog, as the Board won't know of your complaint. So, please let us know now as we have started preparing for 1981.

.....AND FINALLY ON A SOUR NOTE

Repeated exhortations concerning parking and noise, in this journal and announcements by synagogue officials, seem to have gone largely unheeded as we have experienced the results of a petition submitted to Hertsmere Council by the local residents association (formed solely, it seems, to try and stop the unsocial behaviour of the users of Bushey Synagogue).

Some restrictions on the use of the premises have had to be imposed and it has been necessary to go almost cap in hand to our neighbours and seek their understanding and to offer our regrets.

Please do not make it worse. Don't park outside houses in School Lane unless it is absolutely essential. Consider the habits of the local residents - some people like a lay-in on a Sunday morning; they

also like undisturbed evenings and nights so no shouting and arguing in the roadways. They have also been told that as an orthodox community, we are forbidden to use cars on Saturdays!

If you are co-operative and reasonable then there is less likelihood of organised opposition.

## Our Minister writes...

#### NATIVITY PLAYS

Almost every Jewish child who has attended a non-Jewish school is familiar with the Christmas celebrations which play a central part in the school curriculum at this time of the year. Almost every Jewish parent has to weigh up in his or her mind which Christmas activities their children should participate in and which they should not.

May I offer you the following guideline. Where the activity is merely one of jollity, you may wish your child to be a participant. However, where the activity is specifically devotional, it would be wrong for a practising Jew to participate.

The most striking example of this is the Nativity Play. While it may take on the form of a play, it borders on an act of worship and is clearly a devotional and Christian exercise, which Jewish children have the right to be exempt from.

#### FAMILY HISTORY PROJECT

I am introducing a project entitled "The History of My Family" into our Hebrew classes. Entry is open to any pupil aged between 10 and 13.

The entrant should trace back his (or her) family's history as far as he (or she) is able to. Among the points that pupils should take note of are:-

- a) places of origin.
- b) why his (or her) ancestors left their homes to come here (e.g. pogroms, Holocaust, trade opportunities).
- c) professions and how they have changed throughout the

Obviously entrants will require the help of parents and grandparents, and it is hoped that through working on the project, children will appreciate how valuable a source of knowledge parents are. They will also realise something of the variety of their backgrounds and will see how our history has been affected by world events.

Entries should be submitted to the Headmaster, Mr. Fierstone, or myself by SUNDAY 25 JANUARY, 1981. Pupils who submit the best entries will receive prizes.

#### THE SLYK HAGGADAH

On the evening of Tuesday 21st October, Mr. David Brass, the bookseller, who is a member of the Synagogue, spoke at the home of Rev. and Mrs. Salasnik about the work of Arthur Szyk (1894-1951), the Polish-born Jewish painter, illustrator and cartoonist.

Mr. Brass exhibited the originals of the Szyk Haggadah, which is considered to be the most beautifully illuminated Haggadah in the world.

The first edition made from the Szyk Haggadah was printed locally by Sun Printers in Watford during 1940 and it was, at the time, the most expensive new book ever.

### CHANUKAH

In writing about the Festival of Chanukah I do so with some reservation. First I am pretty sure every Jewish person at one time or another has been told about events that took place at that period in Jewish history. Looking back into the past, we find periodically the situation has arisen where our Jewish heritage has been at risk. Even in recent history our race has been threatened with extinction. But we survived then, and by the grace of G-d will continue to survive.

We commemorate at this time the restival of Chanukah. This commemoration is twofold. One, the great stand and vitory accomplished by Judas Maccabeus and his followers, around the years 170 to 160 BCE.

Against all odds imposed on the Jews to abandon the Jewish religion and oppresive measures taken by King Antiocnus and his army in Judea, the Maccabeans, as they became known, fought and won the right to practice Judaism. Incidentally, the victory of Judas maccabeus and his brothers, Jonathan and Simon, who fought alongside him and his followers, oddly enough is not mentioned in the talmud.

Secondly we come to the Hebrew letters Una

It was at the time of the desecration of the Temple in king antiochus's reign, and the re-dedication of the second Temple in 165 BCE that the miracle of the temple lamp oil occurred. The Hebrew letters stand for ness 2 miracle; gadol 2 great; hay 7 was; sham 22 there. The sentence reads; A great miracle took place there.

It transpired that the oil to light the lamp in the Temple was only enough for one day, but eventually lasted eight days. Seen at the time as a miracle, this event is symbolised in every Jewish home by the lighting of the henorah, a candelabrum consisting of eight branches and a centre candle-holder known as the Shamas. Starting with one candle lit by the Shamas light, and increasing each day by adding another candle until all eight candles are alight. Following the blessings of the lights, "moa Tsur's" five verses are sung.

It is appropriate for gifts to be given to children and games are played. A game dating back to sabylonian days is spinning a four-sided cubiform top called a dreidel or trendel. It is the custom to play with this spinning top during Chanukah. It should be mentioned that the sides of the top are engraved with the letters on each of the four sides.

### Education

It is a pleasure to be able to record a number of successful "first-time" occasions that have occurred during the past 12 months.

In February we held our first Melava Malka; in September we started our first Bat Chayil class and in October we held our first Childrens' Shabbat.

For those of you that like "seconds" please note in your diaries that the next Melava Malka will take place on 20 DECEMBER, 1980 and the next Childrens' Shabbat on 28 MARCH, 1981.

Another "first" was the commencement of Basic Judaism classes for Adults. This is exactly what the name suggests and is open to all of you who feel that your knowledge of "basics" needs enlarging. The class is taken by Rev. Salasnik each SUNDAY at Bushey Youth Centre, Falconer Road.

Childrens' services are once again back on a regular basis for which I would like to thank Wendy Pater.

We are now at the season of awarding prizes to the children at our Hebrew Classes. It is our practice to award prizes to those children who, in their class teacher's opinion, have worked hard and progressed during the previous academic year.

Last year's top class lived up to its name and of the 14 children who took the London Board's Junior Examination, 11 passed, 7 of them with either merit, credit or distinction certificates and 2 children received London Board prizes.

This year we have 170 children at our classes, including those at the new location at Bushey Youth Centre, Falconer Road. Obviously when we have such large numbers - and growing each year - we rely increasingly on the goodwill of parents to respond to the Education Committee's requests for help with the weekly rota for preparation and security. In fairness to all, please arrive promptly at the times requested - it is only about once each term.

I am pleased to say that there has been some improvement in parents driving and parking habits at the Synagogue site on Sundays. It is, however, preferable, wherever possible, to park in the High Road rather than School Lane as this does not disturb our neighbours.

Finally, I would like to thank all those parents who have given their help over the last year and have thus ensured the smooth running of Sunday mornings.




